On Maundy Thursday, the Mass of the Lord's Supper will be held at Sacred Heart. After Mass, the Blessed Sacrament is placed at the "altar of repose", which represents the Garden of Gethsemane, where we are encouraged to watch, remain quietly for a while, keeping the Lord company. **The Watch will move to Wardour Chapel at 9pm and go on until Midnight, and Compline (Night Prayer) will be at 11.45.** It would be very helpful if you were able to commit to being present for a period of time during the Watch.
