From Father Anthony

It was impossibly hot and like the cheese on toast, before me, I was melting: but, the iced mint tea was delicious. The garden's head bowed in a collective droop under the heat but a few plants looked up accusingly at the sun as it began to slide towards the west. The gunslinger eyed me from the stump expecting a share of the toast... and got it! Young sparrows clung to the feeder, tucking into fat balls mixed with seeds; how choosy they were! discarding what they did not like. The ground was littered with leftover seeds... all hoovered up by Harry the Pigeon and mates.

Many of us are choosy about what we eat; the diet industry makes billions out of it. I sipped the tea and wondered if, as a spiritual community, we were as choosy about what we let into our minds, especially from the media and advertising. What sustains us interiorly; if we are on edge, unhappy, jealous, dysfunctional what is fuelling it all. The Gospel has an answer.

The Bread of Life (what truly sustains us) is connected with who we really are... our Christ centre, I Am, where we fuse with God. It is often experienced as conscience. However, the interior voice associated with this centre is frequently rejected (is this not the carpenter's son) because it does not accord with the world or our habitual view. Our spiritual voice gets silenced by our worldly, mental diet. The antidote for this is learning and practicing Discernment. Discernment is the manna from heaven. Manna in Hebrew literally means 'what is it?' ma'n hu? מור הוא ביל הוא it? (probably like coriander seeds, and tasted like wafers with honey; tree resin). It was not eaten straight from the ground but processed into something like bread; something to learn from this.

The modern world constantly throws stuff at us. As part of our spiritual practice should we not attempt to slow down and ask, about all the stuff we ingest mentally... what is it? What effect is it having on me? This will provide a space between us and what we are consuming. It will give the voice of Christ within a chance to be heard... and hopefully followed.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Thursday 15 August Holy Day of Obligation

Masses: 10am St Osmund, Midday St Osmund & 7pm St Gregory Vigil Masses on Wednesday 14 August: 6pm St Osmund (Ordinariate) & Downton 6.30pm

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory". The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. There were few dissenting voices. ADOREMUS

The 2024 National Eucharistic Congress takes place at St Mary's College, Oscott on Saturday 14 September 2024. It has been scheduled to coincide with the 53rd International Eucharistic Congress in Quito, Ecuador from 8 – 15 September 2024. This enables us to unite in our parishes, and at Oscott, with the universal Catholic Church as we come before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Unlike Adoremus in Liverpool in 2018, this is not a public event, each diocese will be sending invited pilgrims.

The fact that there are limited, invitation-only places for Adoremus at Oscott doesn't mean that Catholics throughout England and Wales are excluded – far from it. News will follow on how we all can join with this event.

Saint Maximillian Kolbe 14 August - Maximilian became a Franciscan in 1907 and devoted his life to fostering a devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. During World War II, Fr Kolbe hid as many as 2,000 Jewish and Polish people in his Polish monastery. In 1941, Maximilian was arrested by the Nazis who sent him to Auschwitz concentration camp.
