

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD (A)



From Father Anthony.

It was cold and dark with a light dusting of snow: outside Christmas lights twinkled with magical effect. The Cathedral spire loomed ominously; bells announced the hour. I opened the church, lit a candle for us all, said a prayer and went back out to enjoy the winter scene. A blackbird sweetened the air with song; early traffic rumbled and an overhead jet gave a long sigh. And out of the darkness a white pigeon descended and landed on the school roof... straight out of the scriptures!

“... he came up from the water and behold, the heavens were opened for him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove”. Does this not express a spiritual experience we all need this year? To rise out of the darkness of confusion, distraction, longing disappointment, hate and anger of mind into the clarity, safety and oneness of God. To feel and experience the reality of our baptism now and not just as a recorded event. Our problem, like Adam and Eve, is that we have eaten of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil - the birth of good and bad, right and wrong, up and down and so on. We have substituted *two forces for the one and only Force* which is God. Similarly, the prodigal son left the oneness of God for separateness and the appearance of duality in the world... like him we must return from the confusion which duality engenders to the one oneness which is the Father.

Being the one and only force or power, only He can transform us: our part is to allow the conditions where only that power operates in us. Two practical spiritual steps assist His Work. Firstly, seek out and come to interior stillness (*be still and know that I am God*). Whatever you are doing, thinking or feeling come to an awareness of it: be still with it. What you see is what God sees. Seeing what God sees, you become One in the seeing; His *involvement* is the transformation. Secondly, find a line of scripture that captivates your heart and ‘chew’ over it day by day. It is the word of God, His Presence; let it nourish you. With His Presence in your stillness, you will eventually rise out of the powers of mind into the power of Spirit... and the arms of the Father.

THE HOLY TRINITY – LIVING AS GOD’S PEOPLE - 24 & 25 JANUARY

After a wonderful celebration of Christmas in our parish, we now enter a new year of the Lord. Perhaps the most important New Year’s Resolution that we can make is to allow the Lord to work in us this year. To develop within ourselves the conditions that allow God’s grace to transform us, both as individuals and as the Church. It is with this in mind that a locally-based Parish Retreat has been planned – to allow us to begin this work together; for as members of Christ’s body, we draw near to him together, not in isolation. We are delighted that Sisters Carino and Amata, Dominican Sisters of St Joseph have agreed to lead this Retreat in our Parish Centre on 24 & 25th January. They will lead us in a weekend of reflection and formation to help us live out our faith in the Gospel in our daily lives.

The Trinity is the foundation of our faith, professed in the Creed we say together each Sunday. But how can we understand the Trinity in a way that helps us truly “glorify the Lord by our lives”?

There will be four sessions over two days. You are welcome to attend any or all of them, but the programme is designed to offer the greatest benefit if you can join all four. This retreat is open to the whole Pastoral Area and so we advise signing up as soon as possible to secure your place. Today’s Gospel passage speaks of Jesus who, hidden in the crowd, goes into the river Jordan to be baptised by John. As he comes out of the water the heavens are opened, the Spirit of God appears in the form of a dove and a voice resounds from on high “This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased”. In this scene God is revealed in his Trinitarian mystery: the Father, principle and source of life and holiness, The Son, who came into the world to free it from sin and death and the Holy Spirit who’s sustains the work of Redemption with his power. FORTHCOMING CHANGES TO THE SUNDAY & WEEKDAY MASS SCHEDULE

I well remember being told that three things were necessary for the smooth establishment of weekly Mass: *a person, a time and a place...* “mess with any of these and you will confuse and lose your congregations”, said the wise old priest!

Well, we did mess with it!!! and you have borne the inconvenience and confusion with understanding, grace and encouragement. Just to recap: back in the summer we went down to three priests, then two and for a short while, one. It was impossible to cover all the Masses and as a result the 11am at St Osmund's was cancelled displacing over 150 people. St Gregory's moved from 9am to 11am causing not a little confusion, unrest and overcrowding. At the time we said it was an interim measure – although, if I'm honest, I thought it would be permanent.

However, two things have happened. Firstly, our Mass numbers at St Osmund's, in terms of safety, are dangerously high leading to people being invited to watch Mass on screens in the hall – hardly ideal. Secondly, the Bishop has secured a fourth priest for us - Fr George who will live in Amesbury and serve both Christ the King and St George's, Warminster. This makes it possible to ‘mess with the rota again’ and return to the previous Sunday Mass timetable here in Salisbury.

I was minded to keep the Mass times as they are because we *could* be back to three priests next summer and may have all the confusion again. However, I have been persuaded that we must reinstate the 11am at St Osmund's and return the 11am at St Gregory's back to 9am; if for no other reason than to cope with the increased numbers at each of our Masses in the interests of safety. I will have to worry about next summer when it comes!

Therefore, it is my intention to implement the Mass timetable as shown below:

Saturday Vigil Mass	St Gregory	Remains at 5pm
Sunday Masses	St Osmund	Remains at 9am
	St Osmund	Reinstate 11am
	St Osmund	Ordinariate Mass – Remains at 12:30pm
	St Osmund	Remains at 6pm
	St Gregory	Returns to 9am from 11am

This will take effect from SUNDAY 8 FEBRUARY.

This will have implications for Family of Faith which will now return to the Parish Centre in Exeter Street with families arriving after their respective 9am Mass at St Osmund & St Gregory.

Weekday Schedule Changes

St Osmund	Reinstate the Monday 10am Mass
St Osmund (Ordinariate)	Will move from Monday to Tuesday at 6pm
Benediction	Will begin at 5.30pm on both Tuesdays & Thursdays in St Osmund. On Tuesdays, this will be followed by the Angelus at 6pm, immediately prior to the Ordinariate Mass.

At the end of the day '*the buck stops with me*' and after much consultation I have made this decision for which I take full responsibility. I am sorry for the disruption, but I hope you will understand and support the decision.
