## THE MOST HOLY BODY AND Blood of Christ

#### **From Father Anthony**

Hot, lazy, afternoon. Bees hummed: flowers perfumed the air. A climbing rose threaded its way along olive branches like a pink serpent. Love in the Mist shimmered, a sea of blue in green. White topped bushes dusted the lawn with petals. The gunslinger perched amid tangled vines and blood red roses. I abandoned the bind weed: for a moment I felt deep reverence towards the Creator behind it all. Constantly present to me, was I truly present to Him?

I remember a lady, years ago, saying, "I'm an atheist. If I believed what you believe I would crawl down the aisle in absolute humility and devotion. But I don't believe... and nor do you, if your behaviour is anything to go by!" Stinging words: they remain and trouble me to this day. She was pointing out that in the face of such a great Mystery, the Real Presence in the Tabernacle, His Body and Blood on the Altar during Mass, would I not be moved by deep reverence and awe. Yet, observation of 'Christian behaviour' in general, seemed, to her, to point to a lack of devotion and respect. Her parting shot was, "whatever you think is present to you in that box," pointing to the tabernacle, "you don't seem to be present to it". Ouch!

The author of 'the cloud of unknowing' states that God cannot be thought, only loved. If this is true then it offers a way for us to be present to Him who is always present to us... the way of love; which creates respect and devotion. On entering a church and throughout mass we should, perhaps, leave thoughts of how the bread and wine becomes Body and Blood in favour of entering our hearts. We must soften our hearts, leave the tangled knots that thought creates and sink into the Love which we are: the image of God. Love becomes present to Love. We no longer need words or thoughts, for we are in the experience; we are present to Him in Love and as love; not thought. The experience of the Mass will then be the oneness of Love; not the separateness of thought. Love will govern behaviour, not thought. Who knows, we might shout for joy, dance in the aisles out of sheer wonder or gratitude; or prostrate ourselves before such simple yet profound majesty... bread and wine, Body and Blood, Love.

## The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) - Sunday 11 June

Standing at the crowded table in the dim candle light of the Upper Room during the Last Supper, Jesus Christ did not hand out bibles to the Twelve Apostles and solemnly tell them, "Take this, all of you, and read it. This is my book, written for you." Jesus gives us Himself, not a book. On today's Feast, we commemorate God's greatest gift to mankind, the person of Jesus Christ. God gives us His Son, and then Christ gives us Himself, body and blood, soul and divinity, under the *appearance* of bread and wine in the Holy Eucharist. Gift, gift-giver, and receiver meld into one in this Sacrament of Sacraments.
