From Father Anthony...

ADVENT WEEK 3 (C) Gaudete Sunday

I abandoned the car and found some high ground. It was bitterly cold. Watery light poured through cracks in the sky; wood smoke lingered on the air. Somewhere below ponies neighed: crows circled. Bleak fields rolled away to the horizon and the Great Spire looked tiny. I enjoyed the scene and felt refreshed. Back in the warmth of the car I gave some thought as to what I would write about this week.

The word 'refreshing' cropped up several times. One definition is, 'Bringing new energy and strength in a pleasant and often unexpected way'. Change can be refreshing. At the heart of the Gospel there is a call to change; a call to be refreshed. The scriptural word we use is repentance. Repentance often conjures up a scene of coming before God, either in prayer or Confession, so as to demonstrate sorrow for sin with a promise to be good in future. Nothing wrong with that! The word we translate as repentance is metanoia (µɛrávoɪɑ): it literally means, 'a change of mind'. Just as a change of scene can be refreshing so too can a change of mind... a change of thinking. Scripturally, metanoia (repentance) might be expressed as, the desire and intention to ascend from conditioned, monotonous, secular based thinking – which influences our actions - to an attitude of mind that thinks, and influences action, according to the rule of Spirit, i.e. we intentionally seek the possibilities and conditions in our lives where we may express the life of Spirit.

In Gospel terms we, 'share with the person who has none', 'stop collecting more than is owed', 'do not practice extortion', 'do not falsely accuse anyone, 'be satisfied with your wages'. What we let go (abandon) in our attempt to change is the *chaff* mentioned in the Gospel. We relax our reliance on secular and circular ways of thinking and acting that keep us immersed in our own darkness. We *immerse* (*baptise*) our mind in the fire of repentance (*change*)... and experience the refreshing light of Spirit.

The Gospel tells us that repentance is *Good News*. We are enlivened and refreshed by the experience. Repentance lead s us to the *spiritual state* of John - *God is gracious*. This state is preparatory to the experience of Christ. As we abandon our old ways and are immersed in Spirit, God leans towards and touches us with His light (grace).

GAUDETE SUNDAY - 12 DECEMBER

On this, the third Sunday of Advent or Gaudete Sunday, we sense a definite mood change. The austerity of what can be a sombre though hope-filled penitential season is replaced by a shift of emphasis. We see a burst of colour appearing at the Mass today as rose-coloured vestments and advent candle replace the violet and we are urged at the Introit to: 'Rejoice in the Lord and again I say rejoice' or *Gaudete in Domino semper*, hence Gaudete Sunday. Saint Lucy, Virgin, Martyr - 13 December

St Lucy (283-304) was born in Syracuse, Sicily, where she also died. She was of a noble Greek family, and was brought up as a Christian by her mother, who was miraculously cured at the shrine of St. Agatha in Catania. Like so many of the early martyrs, Lucy had consecrated her virginity to God and had devoted all her worldly goods to the service of the poor. SAINT JOHN OF THE CROSS, PRIEST - 14 DECEMBER

In his life and writings, John of the Cross has a crucial word for us today. We tend to be rich, soft and comfortable. We shrink even from words like self-denial, mortification, purification, asceticism and discipline. We run from the Cross. THE 'O'ANTIPHONS Beginning on the 17 December and for seven days following, a special antiphon is read before the Magnificat during Evening Prayer. These special antiphons express humanity's desire and longing for God, a longing which has existed throughout the history of God's people from the beginning of time through Abraham, Moses and David. A history which was fulfilled on the night when Emmanuel (God with us) was born. Each prayer begins with one of seven Old Testament titles for the Messiah now attributed to Jesus.
