# ORDINARY TIME WEEK 15 (A)

From Fr Anthony...

'The sun has got its hat on' blared out from an ice cream van as it rattled past. A dog barked; laughter echoed from the flats. I was cleaning the sacristy. I looked out of the window. Sparrows flitted and squabbled in the vines. Washing danced on the line! It was warm and beautiful. I felt a smile of gratitude. A pigeon launched from the roof, climbed, clapped, and swooped down into the cluster of trees dislodging baby green apples. The path is littered with them. I wondered how many would fall before the crop is ready to eat.

It made me think, what are the seeds of time: seconds? Nearly 2 billion have 'fallen' to get me where I am now! Time; wasted, asleep, hurt, happy, wondrous; getting things right, wrong, and so on. Time has brought me to *now. Now* is the hundred, sixty, thirty-fold mentioned in the Gospel. As well as joy and happiness there will be regrets, things we wish we had done differently, things we wish had not happened. But, all of it brought us to now. It only ever was and only ever will be... *now.* Now is the place where life happens and transforms. No point in looking back in happiness or regret; it is understanding that is needed.

For incarnational life *space* is needed for experience: *time* to modify experience. The 'sacrament of the present moment,' (*Now*), is outside of this, in the sense that it *contains* space and time. (*Isaiah 46; 10*). We constantly come *from* it. We become aware of being aware. We 'see' life as it is lived: 'see' why life was the way it was; 'see' new directions. We understand why we missed the mark (*withered away, got choked, did not grow, got distracted*) and where we hit the mark. We know what to say sorry for and how to be thankful.

Love is the measure by which we evaluate what we 'see'... in other words Christ, He is Love. Time originates in Him and is sustained by Him. He is the author of Now. It is He who scatters the seeds of time so that by using time we change our experience *(repentance)* and come to know that it is in Him *we live and move and have our being*. Knowing this we use space and time correctly. We bear fruit and enter peace and happiness beyond all telling.
