# ADVENT WEEK 3 (B) GAUDETE SUNDAY

# From Father Anthony...

Thick fog hung in the air. It veiled everything... even the Great Spire. Engines muffled past; Cathedral bells intensified the silence. I picked up the milk and went around the back. The side of the church loomed but quickly dissolved into spirals of dirty cotton wool. The garden had vanished. It felt miserable, empty! Then, two blackbirds bounced out of the fog, clucking away. Life emerged out of the foggy wilderness. I felt a wave of happiness as they demanded food.

The Gospel continues with John in the wilderness - it must be important. This week we are given a subtle indication of the quality needed to make a fruitful encounter with interior wilderness. The clue is in the name John. It means; Yah (God) is gracious, merciful, compassionate. John is the quality of humble vet deep acceptance that our Creator loves us and finds us lovable. In the security of this love we experience natural rejoicing; original love is awakened in us; we love as God loves. It is not manufactured or dependent on an emotional cause; it is experienced as always has been, is and will be. It is a place 'in the soul that has never been wounded' (Meister Eckhart). We experience an echo of our original state with God. It leaves us happy (graced), in prayer with God and always thankful. This is the state St Paul talks about when he says, 'always be happy, pray constantly and always give thanks.' He is referring to a state of being that is rediscovered within... John. This is the best state to be in when encountering internal wilderness. Rather than stumbling about, dispirited by the fog of our sin... we burn it away with love. Knowing we are loved unconditionally gives us sufficient confidence to look at and into our sin - where we miss the mark - without flinching or cowering away. Seeing sin for what it is (error) we can let it go; we change our mind (repent).

Confident in love and rising above sin we sense who we truly are (*I AM*) and let go of who we thought we were. *I AM* is a voice (*feeling*) rising (*crying*) out of the wilderness of *error*. As we leave what we are not (unfit to undo his sandals), what we are emerges. The Light, Christ, rises in us. He walks, as us, along the path of our life.

These special antiphons express humanity's desire and longing for God, a longing which has existed throughout the history of God's people from the beginning of time through Abraham, Moses and David. A history which was fulfilled on the night when Emmanuel (God with us) was born. Each prayer begins with one of seven Old Testament titles for the Messiah now attributed to Jesus.
