From Father Anthony

'Blasted weather', said a friend of mine over the phone. 'Will it never stop raining? The economy is collapsing, we've got wars, viruses, you can't trust anyone anymore... what next?' He was on a roll! Later, I unfurled my umbrella and went up the shops. A young gentleman sat cross legged in a shop doorway, damp and clearly in need of funds and food. A lady got out of her car, made off sharply but dropped her purse. He shouted after her. She returned, picked it up, smiled and gave him a fiver. Not all is bad with the world, I thought!

Outside of nature, 'nothing happens on earth that does not first originate in the heart of man'. And so it is to the heart of man and our own hearts that we must turn. We can use our heart to play at being God (many will come in my name). Man's inhumanity towards man originates in the heart. War, insurrection, laws, governments, national flags and kingdoms all come from the heart of man. The way we manage or damage the planet, is a function of the heart of man; it contributes towards, 'earthquakes, famines, and plagues', not to mention viruses! Truth is, 'the buck starts and stops with us.' We have been given free will and St Luke has been challenging us to ask both individually and collectively... how are we using it? How are we adorning the temple of our being? Are we playing at being a god or are we learning humility and placing ourselves at the service of God and our neighbour? It is only by doing this that we can come to love and be of service to ourselves.

All that we make of ourselves and the world must be fit for the Kingdom of Heaven; otherwise it is fit for nothing. The measure associated with that Kingdom is Love: as expressed by the two great laws of the Abrahamic faiths, namely '...love God and your neighbour as yourself'. This love, like prayer, implies an exchange of wishes; we exchange our wishes for those God has for us. We enter into a relationship where God 'rubs off onto us', so to speak. Then we can speak from His Heart to the world (don't worry about what to say) and we will live under his protection, (not a hair on your head will be destroyed).
