From Father Anthony

It was very early and still dark when I set off. Stars twinkled: clouds moved across the moonscape, silent as wraiths. I settled in for the long journey accompanied by some excellent tuck, two travel mugs of tea and the red glow of the dash board. Dark turned opalescent and then burst forth in an explosion of red, orange and blue as the sun woke up. The journey up had been atrocious, so I determined to follow my nose rather than the satnav. I called a friend and we decided on the least likely route and... it ran smoothly. I was back by mid-morning.

'Come follow me'. The sense in which Jesus says follow me is closer in meaning to, accompany Me on My journey, rather than follow Me like sheep. More importantly, it is to follow Him as a real Person rather than an ideology. Following an ideology may have its merits but it is not what Jesus is saying. As a real Person the implication is that we will have met Him for real - not what is and has been said about Him. It implies that He knows where He is going: that where He is going is best for us too. It is handing over to Him all that we are or think we are to find the truth of who we actually are in Him... because in Him we had our being: and only in Him can the light (consciousness) of life in us comprehend or see through the darkness that blocks us from God.

Truth be told, most of us, for various reasons, not least in an attempt to survive, are immersed in the world: in all its mechanisms and culture, including religion. The world represents the height, depth and breadth of our experience. We are rich in all it has to offer. And yet, ultimately, it gives us nothing. Not that everything about the world is bleak or troublesome; much of it can be great fun, lovely and informing. But again, truth be told, ultimately, it leaves us empty, cold and alone, not to mention depressed and stressed.

Each of us is invited by the Gospel to take a really good look at the life we are leading. Are we sad like the rich man, as he walks away? If so it might be time to take a different route and find Jesus.


