#### From Father Anthony...

A bag of shopping in both hands I cut through the Close on my way home. A helicopter tracked along the skyline; it crabbed into the wind and thumped the air. An empty crisp bag fluttered across the Cathedral lawns. A couple passed by, arm in arm, faces affectionate, words blown around them. I unpacked, put the kettle on, and went to check the computer. Mrs Cat sprawled underneath the Sage bush. Elegant as always, she held her head at an impossible angle gracefully moving it up and down, grooming her fur; she gnawed at dainty little paws and then scratched vigorously behind her ears. She got up, stretched luxuriously, blinked and sashayed off.

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. Lent is upon us; a time for internal grooming; a time to re-establish our elegance and gracefulness as images and likenesses of God. To do this effectively, we need awareness and confidence. Awareness that something is not as it should be in our lives (where we miss the mark, sin) and confidence that it can be put right.

Spiritually, leprosy refers to a set of thoughts and feelings that consciously or subconsciously create dysfunction in our lives: that leave us on edge and affect the way we act and behave. Awareness of this is a first step - being gentle and careful, as always, with anything that involves shame. Then we need confidence to hand it over to Christ... and this can be a sticking point. How will we be received by Him? Will he look at us in the same way that we shamefully look upon ourselves? Will He judge or condemn us?

He looked upon the leper with compassion. The word used is splagxnízomai  $(\sigma \pi \lambda \alpha \gamma \chi \gamma (\zeta \rho \mu \alpha))$ . It derives from 'splanxna', meaning inner parts: the heart, lungs, liver, and kidneys... denoting the seat of the affections. In other words, He loves and understands us from His 'guts'. Like the couple arm in arm, He only has affection and love for us. Not condemnation. Lent is a time, not of introspection, self-recrimination and dwelling upon our sins; but a time of 'clearing the decks' so as to rest in His love. It is this Love that is purifying (cleansing), that heals the leprosy within.

We will know when we have experienced it. Our first reaction will be an intense feeling of liberation, gratitude and thanks to God (show yourself to the priests).


