LENT WEEK 4(B) Laetare Sunday

From Father Anthony...

The sun had set in folds of pink and orange. The Avon flowed high and clear; it sliced through the sluice gates. Ducks quacked in the gloaming. I came down Exeter Street after an evening walk. The Church was wonderfully lit for Mass. Stained glass colour spilled through arched windows; flint walls bathed in the soft yellow hue of the outside lamp; the Moon perched beside the tower. I took it all in. A man shuffled by, misread my gaze and said, 'Hmm... money to burn. Look at all 'em lights on!!' Head down, to cover my collar, I mumbled and wished him a pleasant evening. 'Coward', I thought of myself! I remembered that Eastern saying, 'the nature of the rain is the same; it causes thorns to grow in the marshes and flowers in the garden'. As always, 'we see the world as we are not as it is!' Nevertheless, I had something to learn and resolved not to burn so many lights!

Both Advent and Lent are Penitential seasons; both seasons invite us to understand, tame and control the wilderness within us. A basic principle is that impressions from the world are neutral in themselves. We cause and interpret them in terms of how we are within; we give them all the value they have for us. Even if we are not responsible for situations in our lives we are responsible for how we behave in them.

If our Soul is not fully formed (Christ within) we become slaves to external impressions; the temple of our being becomes a tiring market place where they control. If our Soul is formed in the Wisdom, Power and Love of God then, this unified spiritual strength drives the impressions out, renewing the temple of our being in the image and likeness of God. It provides a barrier against the invasiveness of external impressions. We now cause and interpret impressions in terms of the unifying love of God found within. We rejoice (Moses lifted up) because, with this new capacity, we only ever see God in everything, (loved the world so much).

In Advent this rejoicing is called Gaudete; in Lent, Laetare. Gaudete reflects internal joy; Laetare reflects joy that is manifest outwardly. Joy conceived internally before Christmas is expressed externally before Easter. Filled with this joy and rejoicing we express it to one another and the world bringing healing and resurrection.


