

ORDINARY TIME WEEK 33 (B) REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY





I stood, mug in hand; it was cool and damp. Cathedral bells sweetened the air: sparrows darted in and out of the hedge. Gangsters circled and cawed. Beyond spindly branches the roof line was suffused with rising layers of orange and red tinged with blue as the sun began its morning climb. It was breathtakingly beautiful. By contrast, the garden looked drab and forlorn, rusted and fallen. Its very state predicted the deepening winter to come... but the tea tasted good!

We easily read the signs of nature. Brown leaves falling portend the onset of winter; dark heavy clouds portend rain... 'red sky in the morning, shepherds warning', and so on. But, are we as good at reading our own being, our own mood and temperament? And, do we take the time to do so?

Most of us have experienced 'the time of distress': when spiritual understanding seems to fail (sun): intellect cannot cope (moon): all that we hope for (stars) never comes about. Our world gets shaken and perhaps anxiety, despair or worse take over. The Gospel portrays real human conditions not just worldly events. If we experience turmoil; if we feel let down or disappointed, the Gospel suggests we observe and pay attention to our inner being because something might need to change.

Often, what needs to change is, 'the fixed idea'... especially the fixed idea we have of ourselves. Fixed ideas are often at variance with the flow of reality: they leave no room for growth. They may seem to give a sense of identity, security and shape; but, they soon become a prison because they cannot flow with reality which is bigger than any idea. Christ within (our true being) cannot be contained by thoughts and ideas. Ideas need to transform in much the same way that seeds transform into beautiful plants. Anything that hinders the process stunts or kills it.

When we become wedded to a 'fixed idea' of ourselves... we stunt ourselves. This produces an unbearable tension between the movement of our true being (son of man coming) and the fixed idea we have of ourselves which is static. Gently, through self-observation, we must allow the static version to die back: its season is over. When we feel our world is being shaken perhaps it is Christ wanting to emerge in us, as us. The season for this to take place is always... now.


