From Fr Anthony...

High in a clear blue sky, the sun's smile glanced off the school roof and on to the side of the church. Reradiated heat warmed me as I knelt weeding the path. It was welcome after so much rain and cloud. With slinky step Mrs Cat eased along the top path, stopped, gave a withering look and continued with her daily rounds. The Gunslinger tracked my moves, dodging here and there, swooping on unsuspecting grubs! I came across some bulbs, like little onions. Out of something so small will emerge something so big, by comparison. Cells multiply and develop according to a blueprint, extending in size and stature until... a plant, a tree! Amazing.

According to Scripture we have the capacity to develop from worldly to spiritual consciousness. It might begin with intellectual recognition but always leads to felt experience and mystical knowledge that we are spiritual beings. Awareness expands: the 'spiritual seed' within awakens; it produces a new feeling, almost like having a mission we must accomplish. This seed germinates in the desire for something more than the world: it is fed by intention. It develops according to a spiritual blueprint often experienced as remembrance of something lost: an echo within of another homeland. We become the, 'man on his way abroad who summoned his servants and entrusted his property to them'... where abroad is the realm of spirit, the servants our five senses and the property, our spiritual potential.

Accepting that our senses (five talents) are spiritual in origin we begin to expand their capacity accordingly (trading with them) ... e.g. physical sight expands into perceptual 'sight', as in the difference between saying, 'I see a car' or 'I see what you are saying'. It begins with recognition (one talent). We experience, understand and accept that the world cannot give us what we need (weeping and gnashing of teeth): yet we lack the impetus and courage to leave the comfortable and known; we remain cautious, suspicious and reluctant. We may linger like this for a long time, feeling empty (the talent taken away). But, with perseverance and deepening desire we experience an increase in awareness and consciousness (two talents producing two more) until spiritual consciousness (Kingdom of Heaven) is remembered and flows through all our senses (five talents producing five more). More than just an animated body... the life-giving spirit we truly are now flowers in the world.
