From Father Anthony

I drove over a patchwork of rumpled browns, yellows and greens topped with lazy cirrus and porcelain blue. Sweet, damp air filled the car, the silence loud above the hum of the engine. The road sliced through dense forest, then curved out into the open affording a dizzying sight of the valley below. A bonfire blazed filling the air with woodsmoke and hints of Autumn.

I came to cast fire on earth and how I wish it were already kindled. Spiritually, Fire often stands for Purifying Love: purification in the sense of releasing our attachment to things, our misperceptions of the sensory for spirit and our misidentifications of effects for Cause. God is Cause: the world is effect. This Cause, the Centre, is found and experienced as Christ from within; not 'out there'. Effects are discerned through the senses – the household of five. They operate in a world where one thing predicates another. Up predicates down, father, son, mother, daughter, etc. It is a world of opposites. Opposites are effects but very often we mistake one opposite (effect) as the cause of the other. Whereas, we should attempt to find and focus on the balance point, centre or fulcrum from which they both emerge. This is the Cause. It never moves and is always at rest: sometimes called the Unmoved Mover or the Father or Our True Home. This is what we long for... to be at home again in Him

Those who wish to grow in spirit and return home must demonstrate to themselves a desire to receive the Purifying Love (*Fire*) of Christ. Mostly, though, we don't want it (*how I wish it were burning already*) because of the division it will cause in our settled world and how we understand ourselves and others (*the household of five will be divided*). Our identification with and dependence on the outward sensory world will have to give way (*father against son*) so that we can occupy the spiritual realm within from which everything flows. It is a baptism where our sensory world dies for the spiritual realm to rise as our true home. This is not to denigrate the world but to release us from it so that we can see, understand and love it for what it is: and, from the realm of Spirit give it what it truly needs as we become Christ in action, in the world.

War in Gaza - Cardinal Nichols

On the feast day of Edith Stein, St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, Cardinal Vincent Nichols, has expressed his sorrow and condemnation after Israel's security cabinet approved a plan to take control of Gaza City.

"To increase the destruction of Gaza City and then the rest of its territory, in order to defeat a terrorist organisation and movement, is a development that is rightly being condemned around the world. There must be a better way, one that does not heap yet further suffering and misery on so many people who are not combatants but defenceless in face of the perpetrators of violence in their midst.
