ADVENT WEEK 3 (B) GAUDETE SUNDAY

From Father Anthony

After early morning prayers I often spend time listening to local sounds. The silence, cut into quarters by cathedral bells, is palpable. It is beautifully enhanced by bird song and occasionally scratched by yowling cats! High above, long haul jets unzip the sky with long sighs; distant traffic rumbles like a hungry belly... and then it is time for tea.


We have spoken about awareness and staying awake: about preparation and prayer. Now we should examine deepening that prayer by finding a particular place in the soul through silence and stillness. Silence, here, is not referring to the absence of sound but to a quality of soul. 'There's a place in the soul where you have never been wounded', Meister Eckhart. This is the place we must find. How?

"I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord." The word for voice is phóné: φωνή, meaning a sound, noise, voice. As we know, sound is very powerful. It can heal or wound, soothe or irritate, inspire or destroy. As we sink deeper and deeper into the depth of our soul, through the practice of quiet and stillness, we will find a rhythm, a sound, a vibration: shallow at first and perhaps alarming, it is a quality that grows as we seek it out and persevere in it. This is the voice or sound that cries out in the wilderness (depth of the soul). This is the place that has never been wounded by our experience of the world. It is the child within (Son of Man), the untarnished image of God that we are. It cries out to be heard... to be born. It is fed and grows by being encountered and listened too. Placed there by God it is the sound that leads us back to Him. It does not abandon the world but transforms us and all around us. This sound defines our identity. It is not a label; it is the 'I Am' out of which all labels emerge (priest, prophet, etc). It is the sound out of which all was made (God Said: it came to be). In our prayer let us consider going to Her who carried the perfect embodiment of this Voice; Jesus. If we have not done so already it is worth contemplating devotion to Our Lady; after all She is devoted to us.


ADVENT CAROLS & BENEDICTION BY CANDLELIGHT THURSDAY 21ST DECEMBER, 7PM ST OSMUND'S



ADVENT WEEK 4 (B) & CHRISTMAS



From Father Anthony

Perched on a quince tree the gunslinger tried attempted an ambush as I came out of the sacristy... I only just escaped! It was a day with too many moving parts and I was late. The traffic stacked up on both sides of the street so I decided to walk. Breathing in an undelightful mixture of ozone and car exhaust I barrelled along the streets and across the square. It looked magical with all the trees festooned with white lights. The mobile went and broke the moment. I listened and promised the caller that I would send him a message later.

Having spoken about awareness and staying awake: about preparation and prayer: about encountering the sound or voice within (Son of Man or child within) and letting it be born and grow: we are now on the straight (spiritual) path to God. As we go to Him we are, like the angel, sent to others; we transition from being disciples (mathētés: $\mu\alpha\theta\eta\tau\dot{\eta}\zeta$, learners) to becoming apostles. The word for apostle is apostelló: $\dot{\alpha}\pi\sigma\sigma\tau\dot{\epsilon}\lambda\lambda\omega$ to send, send away. The word reflects back to the source or the one sending: it connects the sender to the one sent. We are connected to God and sent by Him with His message; we carry Him.

Like Gabriel we are sent to a town of Galilee called Nazareth to a virgin. The town represents a person, Galilee the mind, (לא galal, means a cylinder: spiritually, the movement of mind); Nazareth means a watch tower; the light within the mind that comprehends the place set aside for God unblemished by the world (virgin). This is the place within able to receive the message we must pass on to others...that Christ must be born in them too. As Meister Eckhart said, "We are all meant to be mothers of God... for God is always needing to be born."

Spiritual practice, to be Christian, must also be for 'one's neighbour as one's self', for this is how God is loved. This is how we are overshadowed by the presence of God and it is this presence that brings about His will, through us, in others, 'that those who are barren might conceive and bring Him forth too'. Once again, we do well to go to Her who created and exemplified this path; who will teach us how to "let it be done to me according to Your Word."
