From Father Anthony...

I ironed some shirts and gazed out of the bedroom window. The garden looked sleepy in golden afternoon sunlight. Sparrows dived in and out of rusting vines and some beautiful purple flowers have bloomed late. The heady aroma of simmering tomato sauce encouraged me to go down and check on it. The simplest sauce but easy to get wrong. Onions, basil, garlic, tomatoes, puree, salt and pepper all lovingly sautéed in olive oil and simmered until everything blends together. I tasted it; yuck! Something was missing. Not seasoned properly. However, it was easily rectified and when balanced... it was delicious.

This week's gospel passage points to something missing. All the ingredients are there: Jesus, James, John and the Ten. Yet, there was an imbalance *(they were indignant).* Last week we spoke about a turning point in spiritual development from *'what I do'* to *'what God does in me'*. The Gospel enlarges on this theme.

Often, when Jesus is teaching or giving a Sign he is accompanied by Peter, James and John. Spiritually, Peter represents the rock of faith, the faculty within each of us that is able to discern what is of God and listen to and act from that faculty only. This faculty enables us to exercise and balance two great arms of spiritual life. They are James, Judgement *(soul)* and John, Love *(spirit)*. The picture we have this week is of Love and Judgment out of balance. Peter *(faith)* is missing – he is not mentioned. Love and Judgment now seek their own ends being without the equilibrium of Faith. The little *'me'* subtly creeps in, *(master we want you to do us a favour)*. Love without Judgement resulting from Faith becomes unbalanced: it centres on that part of self that would make itself god in place of God *(sit on your right and left)*. This we must watch out for. Our spiritual work *(cup and baptism)* must have as its focus *what God wants for us* not *what we want for ourselves...* although the two will eventually coincide!

Faith is like a bottle containing wine; the bottle is servant to the wine. Crack the bottle and the wine is gone. Faith is servant because it contains and balances all our faculties (*whosoever would be first among you, shall be servant of all*). This is why we practice humility and putting the needs of others first; or do we?
