From Father Anthony

Having mowed the lawn, sweating, with arms bleeding after a close encounter of the rosebush kind, I sat and drank tea. I took in pinks, blues, snow white and yellow nestling in the borders and admired the grass, smooth as a billiard table. Sparrows descended and started to peck; blackbirds followed and then gangsters. Obviously, I'd disturbed something in the grass and they were all tucking in. For a moment peace reigned, the sun shone and the air was filled with the scent of the newly mown. Then a quarrel broke out, primarily among the gangsters but, blackbirds joined in too; wisely the sparrows departed. I went in for a shower and left them to it.

The Jews quarrelled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat"? The quarrel continues to this day. I'm sometimes asked, 'do we still believe in the Body and Blood of Jesus: or is it just a symbol?' Perhaps the quarrel continues in our minds and hearts. Maybe, in the face of contemporary arguments we find ourselves perplexed or doubtful. If so, instead of argument we need to find another approach; one that will lead to an understanding and experience of the reality of 'His Body and Blood' in our hearts. The royal road to this understanding and experience is Love. God, let us recall, may be 'grasped' by love: not by thought or argument. In the Scriptures we read "you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your strength". This love is closely aligned to worship... (the Scriptures have eight words for worship meaning: to bow down, dynamic exuberant praise, loud praise, songs of praise, making music with strings, extending hands in thanksgiving, a thanks offering and kneeling in humble submission: do any of these fit?)

Worship of God brings us closer to ourselves; it leads into ourself. Just as when we are angry at someone we are the *first* to experience the anger; likewise, with love and worship. When the soul is in a state of worship it comes very close to Love... it comes very close to its centre; the place where it is fused with God, its Creator... the place it calls *I Am*. Here it might hear, understand and experience, "*I Am the bread of life come down from heaven*". Then, all its questions vanish.

ADOREMUS

The 2024 National Eucharistic Congress takes place at St Mary's College, Oscott on Saturday 14 September 2024. It has been scheduled to coincide with the 53rd International Eucharistic Congress in Quito, Ecuador from 8 – 15 September 2024. This enables us to unite in our parishes, and at Oscott, with the universal Catholic Church as we come before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

The fact that there are limited, invitation-only places for Adoremus at Oscott doesn't mean that Catholics throughout England and Wales are excluded – far from it. On Sunday 15 September the Bishops of England and Wales have invited all parishes to have a period of Exposition to unite the faithful in focusing on the Eucharist with renewed and deepened devotion. On this Sunday there will be Exposition followed by Benediction from 3pm to 5.30pm at St Osmund's.
