From Father Anthony

It was early morning, dark and icy; the sky a black velvet shroud studded with sparkling jewels, a thin waxing crescent of light in one corner. Cathedral bells cut the hour into quarters: a car strained through its gears. A blackbird chirped a single note repeatedly, a conductor tapping his baton. With a unique arrangement of mellifluous notes, a solitary bird replied, proclaiming the day open for business. Others joined in until the air was a marvellous symphony of sound. The tea was good too!

Proclamation is at the heart of our Spirituality. Before we Teach the Faith *(Catechesis)* or Defend it *(Apologetics)* we must have it. Faith begins with a personal encounter with Christ which develops a relationship of trust and certainty. Subsequently it shapes relationships with others and forms human structures... *teaching and defending.* The latter are secondary; the encounter with Christ primary. It is this faith, this encounter, we proclaim to others. Proclamation *(telling others)* is at the heart of Evangelisation *(from the Greek root euangelizesthai, "to bring good news.")*. It has to do with reaching the minds and hearts of others *out of and through our own personal encounter with Christ.* We have to encounter Christ in order to proclaim Him effectively.

What with fewer priests, merging of parishes and closure of churches, Christian life might seem bleak. But, it is the bleakness of the fallow period just before sowing. If the church is to grow once more, and it will, *you and I are the seed.* The encounter with Christ is the element within, that will 'germinate' us, transforming us from an animate soul into a life-giving spirit.

Lent is a time to go out of our 'normal' habitual, tired ways, so as to encounter Christ. The encounter takes place at the level of thought, feeling, intuition and inspiration. We go within (wilderness) and deal with the stormy, violent, accusatory side of our nature (*Satan*): we confront unruly, dysfunctional, thoughts (wild beasts) so that the message of Christ (the angels ministering) may reshape our minds causing us to change the way we think and feel (repentance). The natural person gives way (John arrested) to the spiritual person (Jesus coming into Galilee). We encounter Christ in our minds and hearts and the Kingdom of Heaven is released and experienced in us. This is our purpose or fulfilment (*is at hand*): this is what we bring to others.
