From Father Anthony

After several weeks of absence, the Gunslinger made an appearance. Torrential rains passed leaving behind a refreshing breeze which cleared the air and ruffled his feathers. We eyed one another affectionately and I greeted my little friend with some crushed peanuts... which brought the Gangsters flocking down. The Brown Sparrows held formation around the olive trees and waited to land. Caught up and distracted *'by the things of this world'* none of us noticed another guest; this one was silent, reflective and deadly. Mrs Cat! Fortunately, Henrietta saw her and shrieked, sending everyone heavenward... no one was eaten!

In the Gospel parable we find the master praising the unjust steward for his astuteness. This might seem strange... praise for dishonesty? Spiritually, he is being praised for his ability to *reflect and act upon the situation he found himself in...* not for his dishonesty! The word translated as 'astuteness' $\varphi p \acute{o} v_{I} \mu o \zeta$, phronimos has the sense of 'how we size things up'. The unjust steward does not accept his predicament. He 'uses his head' as well as his heart to influence an outcome. He doesn't sit back: he takes charge.

Very often the spiritual life is depicted as being passive rather than active; as ignoring the world. This is inaccurate and far from truth. We all know the saying, 'the only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good people to do nothing'. The spiritual life is not about passivity; it is about remembering Spirit so as to act in the Spirit to transform the world. The spiritual person cannot and must not ignore the world.

Traditionally, being astute (*spiritual*) requires Knowledge, Understanding and Wisdom (*Grammar, Logic, Rhetoric, in old speak... sometimes called the Trivuum*). Firstly, acquire Knowledge. Secondly, understand (*assimilate*) it. Thirdly, act on it to *manifest an outcome (Wisdom)*. This is the antithesis of sitting back and hoping that everything will just come right. It requires effort and work accomplished by a *receptive heart* willing to receive information and an *alert mind* ready to act on it... Mrs Cat! Spiritually, ignorance (*not Nescience*) is turning away from (*ignoring*) available knowledge thereby precluding relevant and necessary action... *the sin of omission*! All too often we simply accept what is thrown at us by 'the world': this is the real passivity. We fail to be alert to and challenge the evils of Governments, Institutions and Corporations. No wonder we get bitten!
