### From Father Anthony

I wrapped up and sat outside. It was cold and dark. A startled blackbird shrieked and chattered away into the gloom. A slice of the moon shone brightly amid a sprinkle of stars. I listened. Rustles in the hedge, a jet high overhead; someone coughed; a door slammed. I responded to each sound with a mixture of intrigue, escapism and irritation. It led me to awareness of sounds within... my chattering mind! I alternated listening between outside and inside and eventually found stillness and guiet. As always, it brought a gentle wave of peace.


In the Second Reading it says, "... Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me, in holocausts and sin offerings you took no delight. Then I said... 'behold, I come to do your will, O God.'" We were created and given individuality (a body prepared for me) so as to learn to do His will, (we, His image, seeking to become His likeness). Deep listening helps with understanding what motives us. Are we motivated to do His will or our own? Do we live as He would live? Are we becoming like Him? Or, are we attempting to appease and bargain with Him (sacrifice and offering) whilst remaining entrenched in our own will? In Advent we attempt to discern our thoughts and actions to see if they accord with what God would think and do in our place. We ask, 'what is the quality of experience that distinguishes His will from ours?'

In the Gospel we read, "For the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears the child in my womb leapt for joy". To hear Mary is to hear the sound of one who carries the Lord within her. The effect of hearing this is to make the child within (the soul) leap for joy. Interior listening makes us aware of whether or not the thoughts behind our actions contain the Lord. If they do we experience a quality of Joy... whatever the world throws at us. If Joy is not present we may still be rooted in our own will... but this we can modify (repentance).

As we acquire the skill of interior listening we learn to listen to others in whom the Lord is also contained. We learn to discern Christ in them. Christ hears Christ in the other and our souls leap for Joy.
