From Fr Anthony...

A cool breeze washed away the heat of the day. Sparrows, Swifts and Blackbirds provided the evening Choir with Rosemary, Sage and Mint the Incense...the Gunslinger trilling top notes. Fading light from the West cast a fringe of orange over the East and monkish shadows in the garden. A helicopter faded away slapping and chopping the air. Then I spotted it. Bind weed. A whole tangle of it! Ham fisted, impatient, all intention and no brain... I plunged into battle. Rip, pull (ouch, a thorn). Away came the bind weed... and two really pretty flowers with their roots. How biblical, how sad. In my haste to rid the world of weed. I rid it also of beauty!

I thought of the tapestry again... pull out the ugly knots and you pull out the picture. Both sides make the whole. My sinful nature is tied to my Godly nature. I am one being with two sides; not two beings. The blessing, is that I can observe the being I am. I can observe the dark and the light sides of my nature. The 'l' (image and likeness of God) is the observer. It is outside that which it observes... me. Observation is everything!

We are often encouraged to 'resist' sin. Resistance ties you to what is resisted and gives it power over you. It is always there... but kept at arm's length. You expend energy pushing it away. Push it out the front and it comes in the back! Resistance keeps it alive. Tied together it feeds off your good energy: you receive its dark energy. Resistance causes friction, damage and loss of energy: it is draining. Resistance is not the way.

Observation is about *renouncing* not *resisting:* a subtle difference. Observing both light and dark you choose only to look at the light; you deprive sin of attention and energy. 'Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel' (Ash Wednesday). This 'turning away' is Renunciation. By choosing to turn away you maintain freedom; you freely choose to focus on what is good, wholesome and Holy about yourself and receive back similar energy.... a mirror reflection. Gradually the dark side falls away for lack of energy (collected and burnt). Being Spirit the 'I' feeds by reflection the good in you allowing it to continually grow. The Observer and observed become one... then we are whole and unified: in Christ.

The use of PPE by our Stewards

While doing our best to protect parishioners from any possible transmission of the virus by the use of PPE by our stewards, we are also aware of our need to minimise the use of items that cause damage to the environment.

In line with the message of 'Laudate Si', we are looking to source biodegradable and reusable items to reduce as far as possible any non-recyclable waste while maintaining the hygiene and safety required to protect our parishioners and comply with the guidelines set by the government and the Bishops' Conference.

As a result, we have washable fabric masks available for the stewards and are using biodegradable cloths for the cleaning of the benches after mass. The diocese has now issued reusable rubber gloves that can be washed and sanitised and we will be obtaining biodegradable rubbish sacks for the disposal of used items.
