From Father Anthony

I finished praying the Rosary and entered into the silence that always follows... but, too early for tea! I let the silence grow. Cool air drifted through the open window: Brown Sparrows began their morning conference: an early morning jet sighed overhead. The sun began its slow climb scattering orange light through cracks in the cloud. The more I let the silence build the more my mind chattered; worries, concerns, *fuss, bother and itch... 'the yapping mind!'* Yet, it is in the noise and confusion of these jumbled thoughts that Christ can be found.

Jesus withdrew to the district of Tyre and Sidon. Spiritually Tyre and Sidon represents the yapping mind: the constant jumble of sensory thoughts and behaviours. Jesus withdraws into this. He withdraws into our mind. There is no need to run from the mind or accuse it; no need to stress and strain over it because it is here that Christ can be found. The art is spotting His presence. It is not necessarily the fine, linear, orthodox thoughts that spot him: nor the lofty silence. Often it is the little yapping thoughts *the house (puppy) dogs that feed off the scraps He leaves behind.* It is *in* and *around* these thoughts that faith can be found.

We should distinguish between faith and belief. Faith involves belief. Belief, to an extent, is generated by us. Faith is generated by God. Faith is given by God not manufactured by man. The word we translate as *faith* is *pistis*, π i σ Ti ς : it derives from a root which means *to be persuaded*. God persuades us, in our minds and hearts, to prefer what He wants for us; we are gently bent towards His will, not by force or coercion, but by Love: love, which prefers what the other wants. Our wayward thoughts, because they are wayward, without a home: because they live in fear, anxiety, confusion and much else too: all these are susceptible to His gentleness and care. Christ in us is the Faith we speak about; He is the living expression of the Father that resides in us; He can *persuade us* that things can be different: that we can prefer what the Father prefers. It is the discordant, confused thoughts that need and want Him: they make us aware of Faith (*Christ*) already residing in us. Maybe we need to love the *yapping mind;* not run from it!

Parish Update from Father Anthony

Dear Friends,

I hope you are well and enjoying the summer. If you have been on holiday I hope you are refreshed and enjoyed it: if you are going or are about to go away, I wish you all the very best... come back refreshed, safe and sound.

A fair amount has taken place this year, not to mention the roof & ceiling at St Osmund's, pigeons in the belfry, the refurbishment of St Gregory's Church, work in St Gregory's Hall and permission granted by Bishop Declan to close Holy Redeemer. Onwards and upwards - so I would like to update you, as promised, on the following:

i. Holy Redeemer Proposals are being developed for the use of the land at Holy Redeemer. We are waiting on the Diocese: as soon as I have something concrete I'll come back to you.

ii. Parish Centre I propose to create a Parish Centre at St Elizabeth House, Exeter Street to be known as the Parish of Saint Osmund, Parish Centre: obviously, as a merged parish, this includes all our communities from Whaddon, Downton, Holy Redeemer, Saint Gregory's and St Osmund's – the title simply reflects the name of the merged parish and not the church of the same name. The present tenants are departing and there is an opportunity to reclaim that part of the premises they rented from us. Exactly how and what it is used for will need to be explored and refined but its uses may include youth work, the elderly, parish lunches, coffee mornings, First Holy Communion preparation and Confirmation preparation... and it has plenty of parking! This Parish Centre will be in addition to our current use of that part of the building known as St Elizabeth Hall which we currently hire out on a business footing to generate income for the parish and will continue to do so.

If you feel you could assist in developing the aims, objectives and uses of the Centre – especially its management and administration - I will invite you to attend a facilitated workshop, venue and date to be announced: for now, I'd be very grateful if you would consider ways in which you could assist and be a part of the process of establishing this Centre and get in touch if you'd like to be involved.

iii. Youth

a. Two people have shown interest in becoming our parish youth worker. This is very good news. We will conduct interviews and I'll let you know the outcome.

b. I propose to trial an afterschool club on Sep 20, 27 & Oct 4, 11. It is aimed at primary-aged children who would come along with their parents to St Osmund's Church Hall for about 40mins directly after school finishes. It will be a chance for me to get to know the children and introduce them to various aspects of the sacraments, church life and basic church teaching – nothing too onerous. It will also be a chance for parents to get together over tea or coffee. Parents, please let me know what you think of this idea.

c. Following the after-school trial I will be inviting those Confirmed earlier this year along with those of the two preceding years to a series of get-togethers on Oct 18, 25 & Nov 08, 15. Again, this will be a trial and a chance to socialise, explore further and expand on the life of youth in our churches; it might lead to youth Masses and a series of youth clubs!

iv. Parish Pastoral Council Our Pastoral Council will reform in the Autumn. Details to follow soon. Love and prayers

PARISH FINANCES

Dear Parishioners,

The St Osmund Parish Consolidated 2022 Financial Statements, which include the results of St Elizabeth Hall and House are now on our website. These can be found by clicking on the 'Finance' button on our homepage or <u>click here</u>. There are printed copies available in all of our churches. I apologise for the delay in publishing the 2022 results and in order to provide you with a more current position, the results for the first six months of 2023 are also presented on the same page.

We should not be complacent about the fact that at the end of 2022, net assets totalled just over £1M as the operating surplus for 2022 was only £10,735 and, after excluding the income generated from our rental properties, there was a loss of £55,400. For the first six months of 2023, after excluding the impact of the rental properties, the loss escalated to £101,765. This loss was mainly attributable to the cost of repairing the St. Osmund's Church roof, refurbishing St Gregory's Hall and Church and removing asbestos from parish properties. We anticipate further significant costs, including the costs relating to the works identified as part of the quinquennial assessment with the Diocese, to ensure that the St. Osmund and St. Gregory properties are 'Fit for Purpose'.
