From Father Anthony

Another glorious day, ozone fresh with hints of salt and seaweed. Sunlight danced across the sea. Lowry figures peppered the beach; children shrieked and splashed; waves lapped against the harbour wall. Northern gangsters, silver hatted and black suited, just like their southern cousins, stood sentry along the cliff face warding off gulls. And, just below, a solitary woman sat, alone and quiet.

At a certain level Martha represents an aspect of soul concerned with doing: Mary with being. Obviously, it is necessary to do things otherwise nothing would get done! But, the best spiritual outcome is achieved when what we do is a result of awakened being. This has to do with the cultivated ability to listen and to hear; to listen so deeply that the 'Word', through which everything came to be and which is behind everything, may be discerned, understood and acted upon. It is this being aspect of soul that Jesus, in the Gospel, urges us to cultivate so that it informs and directs what we do in the world. Being comes before doing... beautifully illustrated when Simon (to hear) becomes Peter (the rock) upon whom the church, and therefore all of us, is built upon.

However, a world centred upon utility and materialism has little time for being and attempts to reduce life to systematised, rote like doing. It puts the cart before the horse and wonders why it is in such a mess! This puts us in danger of forgetting, or of not bothering, to develop the spiritual shepherd within us (being). Consequentially, like sheep, we trust and blindly follow political, judicial, educational, media and other worldly voices. Beware! the fate of sheep is at best they get fleeced; at worst they end up with the mint sauce.

Jesus entered a village. He enters our Being. He is found within and it is from within that we must listen for His voice; especially from our troubled, anxious areas; where we feel He is not listening to the many prayers we have made leaving them ignored and unanswered. If we listen in the present, disembodied from past or future, we might hear our name called, followed by ... you are anxious and worried about many things but one thing is necessary. We will then be led to the quiet cloisters of our soul from where everything we are inspired to do will be transformed by His Presence.

GAZA'S HOLY FAMILY CHURCH
