From Father Anthony...

One of those days! Phone calls, emails, paperwork, diocesan business, visits, shopping and house cleaning, liberally mixed with unrelenting heat, had me frazzled. I sat by the window. Soft blue, 'love in the mist' (*Nigella damascene*), swayed in a green breeze; red roses followed the sun by the sacristy door. Swallows (*recently returned*) whistled and cartwheeled the sky. Grave stones poked through the vines. I matched their stillness and sought for the silence, just beyond the noise of my mind... and then the gangsters began a furious quarrel with the crows. Someone clapped their hands. Alarmed, they all departed like black rags flapping in the wind. So much for peace!

Last week we spoke of the spiritual practice of moving awareness from Things to Thoughts to the Thinker; from world to spirit. Tired of the world and its failure to satisfy *(multitudes),* we go within *(boat).* We push away from awareness of things and *cross to the other side...* to awareness of the world of the Thinker *(spirit).* We seek peace and understanding... and encounter the world of Thought! Like great waves, thoughts crash about and disturb us *(distractions)*! Worries, angers, anxieties or comforting day dreams, flood over us. We become alarmed and despondent. Time given to silence and inner prayer becomes a noisy disaster. The world no longer satisfies us; yet we cannot reach the place that might. A double bind. Perhaps we begin to think, 'what's the point'?

The *point* has nothing to do with achieving some sort of *nirvana*, some sort of self-congratulatory interior peace. '*Failure*' is important. Proportionate to the strength of our intention for inner peace and understanding it coaxes our awareness towards Christ... *asleep in the stern of our being*. Christ, who encouraged us to make this journey across the lake of our mind (*sea of Galilee*), sleeps within us. The *point* of the journey is to waken Him. It is He, not us, who will still the storm of life and restore us to Spiritual sense. The *point* is Him... not us.

For a while our thoughts are like "the sons of Anak, who come of giants. And we were in our own sight as grasshoppers, and so we were in their sight." (Numbers 13;33). As we persevere with the journey across our mind, Thought becomes the grasshopper. We rise above it becoming the Giant. We experience Him as I Am... not 'me'.
