From Father Anthony

I parked up, stretched and took in the view. Rolling fields, yellowed with age, chased one another into the distance and bumped against a lazy sky. I let the line of the horizon take me somewhere into myself and relaxed. Crows cawed above: a fast jet climbed hard and rent the air. Cows took no notice and carried on munching succulent grass... a lovely example of a higher formation (*cows*) dependent on a lower formation (*grass*).

The disciplines of theology, philosophy, psychology, metaphysics, etc, can be of great assistance to our spiritual development; they widen and stretch the mind, make us more pliable, and expand our soul view. The reason for expanding the soul is to give it a wider range so that it can focus reliably and correctly... on the person and reality of Jesus. If the various disciplines assist us to do this they are of service; if not, they become a hindrance. Worse still they can boost our pride and reliance on self and our studies: they can give us a sense of superiority, trapping us in the relentless motion of the mind, *seeking but never finding!*

The spiritual life has a definite end; to find and know Jesus; to hand over all we are to Him: to 'die' to self in order to live in Him. He bows down to us so that we (humanity) become the ground of His Being... which ground was, in fact, created by Him, the Ground of all Being! What a marvellous mystery! He creates us, lets us go in freedom, joins us and calls us to find ourselves in Him... and all because of Love.

In order to stimulate us to love and find Him, Jesus left us His Life and Passion - Washing of Feet, Scourging, Crowning with Thorns, Crucifixion, Descent into Hell, Burial, Resurrection. By meditating on and allowing these aspects to inhabit us we come to know and strengthen aspects of ourselves and the world. A first stage *(washing of feet)* is to cease idolising self and cultivate profound reverence for God and everything created by God; understanding our smallness: that the superior must always bow down to the lower... for without the lower the superior cannot stand *(e.g. superior plant life cannot stand without the inferior ground)*; or as the Jesus puts it, "whoever desires among you to become first, will be the slave of all".
