From Fr Anthony...

Early morning mist hung in the air. It was cool, damp and earthy. A train rattled in the distance. The 'gangsters' loitered and squabbled. Harry 'the pigeon' cooed and the 'gunslinger' called me out... with a beautiful song. Greens are turning brown but there are still splashes of colour and a beautiful pink rose. The rising sun cast a ruby red glow; the flats gleamed and reflected it. The mist descended. Its wispy tentacles clung to treetops and floated down like grey veils, obscuring everything.

The Gospel alerts us to a 'veil' that hinders contact with reality and therefore, with God gifts. We read, *'why be envious...'* properly translated, *'is your eye evil because I am generous'*. The *evil eye* was a Hebrew expression referring to Envy. Envy, along with Pride and Resentment, obscures reality; they are 'deadly' for spiritual development.

Envy seems to be about avarice, greed, etc. But, it is deeper. For example, I want a car. I can save up, lease, take out a loan, or go without or I might be given one! Whether I like it or not this will be my actual experience. If I am sufficiently aware I can find God in it. Every moment is perfectly constructed so that I can find God's intention behind it and, therefore, what is being offered. If God's intention and mine coincide, we are one; if not, I have something to learn. Life as it is lived is the teacher.

When I envy you because you have the car... it goes beyond the car. Effectively, I want to capture your experience. I want to be in your shoes. Envy, like a veil, obscures my own experience. It takes me away from reality into the realm of *'I wish'* or *'if only'*. But, I can never have your experience; I can only have my own. Through contact with life *as it is lived* I develop something of my own... only then have I something to give.

Each moment contains the 'developing world' of each life... the *vineyard*. To access it we have to be present to it, *as it is*. By accessing the world *as it is* we come to understand how to transcend each event and find its spiritual meaning and the Kingdom of Heaven. At what hour this happens is not important. That it happens, is. The reward is the same for all... spiritual awakening.

Thomas Lawes - Ordination to the Priesthood & First Masses



As many of you know, Thomas was raised here in Salisbury, lived in Holy Redeemer parish and attended both St Osmund's and St Joseph's schools. For part of Thomas's childhood, the family lived in Fotherby House (the former presbytery at Holy Redeemer) and we have been praying for Thomas since he entered seminary at St John's, Wonersh in Sept 2014. It is with great pride and joy that we look forward to Thomas's Ordination to the Priesthood on 26 September at 11am in Clifton Cathedral. It is sad that, due to the current COVID restrictions, we cannot organise a

coach and his Ordination has to be an invitation-only occasion. However, we are delighted to announce that **Thomas is coming back to Salisbury to preside at his first Masses** over two weekends: 27 Sept (the morning after his Ordination) and 3/4 October (the following weekend). We anticipate that these Masses will get booked very quickly, so do book early if you would like to attend in person.

We will be presenting Thomas with a gift from our parishes to mark his Ordination and, if you would like to contribute to this gift, there are envelopes available in all of our churches this weekend.
