From Father Anthony

Another long drive. Sweltering heat, heavy traffic and motorway closures frayed my nerves. I abandoned the motorway, navigated across the beautiful North York Moors and then up the coast. Mercifully, temperatures dropped and tempers cooled. Close to the destination fog drifted over the sea front like fat twists of candy floss. Salty air seeped into the car. Lights shimmered in the gloom and a fog horn moaned in the distance. I slowed down to a crawl and became totally absorbed in watching the fog lights of the car in front. And, arrived!

At some stage in our spiritual lives we have to become totally absorbed in wanting Christ... in following Him. Not because we have been told to do so but because our intuition tells us that only He will do. It's like a hazy awareness of another presence *(teaching)* making its way through our thinking, emotional and willing centres, *(through towns and villages Jesus went teaching)*. We come to realise that only His way leads to real and lasting truth and peace *(making His way to Jerusalem)*. This total absorption is the *narrow door*.

Our 'normal way of life', rooted in the world, distracts us from the intuited 'way of Christ', rooted in spirit. We have to be alert to these distractions and strive to remain focussed on the intuition: it can be agonising. Jesus tells His followers, 'strive to enter by the narrow door. The word strive (ἀγωνίζομαι agónizomai) means to struggle; from it we get our word agonise. Faced with the way of Christ and the way of the world we struggle (agonise) over how to follow Christ. However, the struggle is not about a simple choice between the way of Christ and the way of the world (senses). It is a struggle, an agony, because the two are of different orders: they can't speak to or understand one another. One uses the language of spirit: the other the language of the world. Because we can talk about them we think we understand them (we once ate and drank in your company): but we don't understand (I do not know where you come from). It is not a work that we can do; we are not equipped for it. It is a work that Christ does in us. Our work (struggle) is to remain alert and receptive to His travelling within us. He will do the rest.
