From Father Anthony...

It was a turquoise evening. Fluffy cloud, grey bottoms and pink tops, slid across the sky. Windows reflected the setting sun. Lily of the Valley drifted seductively on a faint breeze. Mrs Cat stretched luxuriously across the tattered shed roof soaking up the last few rays; Henrietta clucked around my feet. The garden was still threadbare but greening over... with the promise of colour to come. I love the yearly cycle of nature; how easy it seems to let go; how easy it returns to its original glory.... and, so biblical!

After our wilderness experience and subsequent encounter on the mountain (*transfiguration*); at some stage our *Intellectual Reason (Greeks)* will waken and begin an internal search. It finds that security, wealth, power and knowledge still leave it seeking. But now it encounters Philip! Philip means *lover of horses (power of the mind)*. It encounters a force (*love*) that will harness and control the disparate forces of the mind (*horses*). This force 'summons' the strength of the Soul (*Andrew*); together they are a formidable. They bring Intellectual Reason to the Essence of its own being (*Jesus*).

In the presence of Jesus, Reason understands that Christ cannot be Glorified; Christ *is* Glory! But, the Soul *(the son of man),* however distorted, *can* be restored to the image of Christ that it is and therefore, glorified. The word for Glory ($\delta o \xi \dot{a} \zeta \omega - doxaz \dot{o}$) conveys the meaning of *'ascribing weight by recognising real substance or value'*. Glorifying God would mean, *personally acknowledging God in His true Character or Essence*. Going within, Reason recognises and values the Soul for what it truly is; the gateway to Spirit and the Experience of being an Image and Likeness of God. In this recognition the Soul is Glorified *(lifted up)*. Its original Glory is restored.

Reason understands that its former ways must die (as a grain of wheat dies). The word for die ($\dot{\alpha}\pi\sigma\theta\nu\dot{\eta}\sigma\kappa\omega$ – apothnéskó) stresses the 'ending of what is former so as to bring about what naturally follows'. The word does not mean a final ending or oblivion. It is gentler... more positive. The ending of former ways is achieved by what our Intellectual Reason has begun to understand already: that it cannot find the answers it craves from the world... it cannot live for itself (love your life). It must brush this aside (hate its life) and allow Christ, Glory, to speak and shine from within.

Covid-19: UK NATIONAL DAY OF REFLECTION TUESDAY 23 MARCH

The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales have urged the faithful to make the National Day of Reflection on COVID-19 a day of prayer as well as a day of reflection. Tuesday 23 March, the anniversary of the first national lockdown, will be marked with a minute's silence at midday. At 8pm, people are encouraged to create a 'beacon of remembrance' on their doorsteps by beaming phones, candles and torches into the night sky. Prominent buildings and landmarks will also be lit up across the UK. "For all who live by faith in God, reflection and prayer always go hand in hand. Prayer completes reflection. Reflection informs prayer. Prayer opens our life to its true horizon. So let us make the 23 March truly a day of prayer."
