THE MOST HOLY BODY AND **BLOOD OF CHRIST**

From Father Anthony

I parked, climbed a hill and took in the view. Soft, curvy fields, in velvety shades of green, rolled into the distance. A large black crow eyed me suspiciously from a rickety fence. The sun played hide and seek with puffs of clouds gliding across an ocean of blue. It was lovely. But I had an eerie sense of being seen by it all and, strangely, it left me feeling deserted and alone.

'..... for we are in a deserted place here.' Very often the individual and collective experience of life leaves us feeling deserted and alone and nothing seems to nourish us. The message of scripture is that only Jesus, through the Holy Spirit, can nourish us so that we will never feel hunger, loneliness or desertion again. Science, Philosophy, Psychology, Spirituality etc, cannot give what Jesus gives; because they find their fulfillment in Him.

Our experience of the world is conditioned by our five senses, thoughts and feelings (spiritually, the five loaves and two fish). Too often we allow the world to lead us; but it is incapable of leading. That is not its job. Its roads lead nowhere, its houses give no shelter, its food cannot satisfy, its friendships end or drift away and so on. Into our senses, thoughts and feelings Jesus come's if invited. Through the Holy Spirit He will order our misused senses and our many dysfunctional thoughts and feelings (the five thousand). Traditionally there are twelve stages of spiritual development (twelve baskets left over). When He has finished with us, we will be developed, whole and complete; no longer being led by the world. On the contrary, we will lead it. Through the Holy Spirit, we will lead it back to Him through whom it came to be in the first place!

There are many things we must do and must be done; but, put God first and then do them. Sit down in your lonely, desolate place, i.e. slow down; find some space to invite Him into these desolate, lonely areas of your soul. Know what you want: feel it vibrantly. Then surrender it to Him. Let Him 'feed' you, arrange your life and give you what you need. Increasingly as you feel His guiding Presence in life, as it unfolds, you will recognise Him more fully in the mystery of His Body and Blood at Mass... and share Him with others.

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI) - SUNDAY 22 JUNE

Standing at the crowded table of the Upper Room during the Last Supper, Jesus Christ did not hand out bibles to the Twelve Apostles and solemnly tell them, "Take this, all of you, and read it. This is my book, written for you". Jesus gives us Himself, not a book. On today's Feast, we commemorate God's greatest gift to mankind, the person of Jesus Christ. God gives us His Son, and then Christ gives us Himself, body and blood, soul and divinity, under the *appearance* of bread and wine in the Holy Eucharist. Gift, gift-giver, and receiver meld into one in this Sacrament of Sacraments. We have a reflection from Jeff Cavins (Ascension Presents) on today's readings. He discusses the Tradition of the Eucharist handed down to us through Christ and addressed by Paul in the Second Reading, and he shares his thoughts on the Gospel story of the multiplication of loaves and fish.
