OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST KING OF THE UNIVERSE

From Fr Anthony...

It was cold but fresh. Sky stretched into the west, wide and steely. A distant line of trees stood sentry as Canada Geese socialised in the meadows. High against green topped banks the river ran fast, silent, and clear: the splayed limbs of river weed leaned and bobbed on the current. Cathedral bells struck the quarter hour: children laughed in the distance. I felt my heart lift! Later, I remembered the lines by Angelus Silesius, 'Do not seek God in outer space... your heart is the only place in which to meet Him face to face.'

Scripturally, the heart is the home of Desire... feelings of wanting or wishing for something necessary for life, leading, ultimately, to desire for God. Desires are referred to as 'the nations', (all the nations will be assembled before him). The desire, in the heart, for God is called Israel (ישראל,) yashar and el meaning, straight to God). Israel moves towards God by correcting all desires (nations) so they reflect how God lives and desires. God is too big to comprehend; but our neighbour, in whom God resides, is not. Desires are corrected by living for and finding God in our neighbour, i.e. awareness of personal desire leads, through perception, to awareness of our neighbours' desire; we live in a manner such that their desire is fulfilled, where appropriate, as well as ours. Finding God in each other we live for one another. This releases us from the confinement (eternal punishment) of selfcentredness.

To be clear; we are not attempting to eradicate desires; simply correcting them by using them to understand the desires of others; intending their needs be met. What we will not accept for ourselves... we will not accept for others. When we receive from others we do so with the intention of giving them the pleasure of giving... not with the intention of pleasing ourselves.

Deeper, there are desires affecting the inner person, e.g. the desire for being accepted for who we truly are, without condemnation or conditions. Knowing this for ourselves we treat others accordingly... we clothe them with our love, understanding and acceptance (clothing the naked stranger). Refusing to see others through the limitation of a social label we release them from a social prison, and so on.

The person whose heart is corrected in favour of God, through his neighbour, has Christ within him as King of his heart.

Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas Primas ("In the first") to respond to growing nationalism and secularism. He recognised that these related societal ills would breed increasing hostility against the Church. Today reminds us that while governments and philosophies come and go, Christ reigns as King forever. In 1969, Pope Paul VI amended the title of the feast from "Christ The King" to "Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe". He also moved it to the new date of the final Sunday of the liturgical year. Andrew Dung-Lac, a Catholic convert ordained to the priesthood, was one of 117 people martyred in Vietnam between 1820 and 1862. Members of the companions group gave their lives for Christ in the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries, and received beatification between 1900 and 1951. It is now clear that social-distancing and booking a place at Mass are still going to be required over the Christmas period. This severely limits the number of attendees at any one Mass but we are committed to ensuring that as many people as possible will be able to come to Mass at Christmas. To that end, our priests are celebrating many more Masses than is normal. **We strongly encourage you to book your place at a Christmas Mass as soon as possible**. This will not only secure a place at the Mass you wish to attend but it will also help us enormously, enabling us to spread the workload of taking bookings, organising and recruiting stewards, arranging church cleaning between each Mass and seat-planning.
