From Fr Anthony...

A bird feeder dangled from the vines and swayed in the breeze. Sparrows clung to the sides like free climbers. The gunslinger has put on weight! And, after his churchly incarceration, Harry the pigeon, is united with his mate again (ah). The garden is beginning to enter the evening of its days. Leaves are turning brown; bushes and trees have a discernible hunch or droop. Hanging fruits burst with colour, fall and litter the paths. Red roses are still flowering though. One bush seemed unnaturally bowed down. Rain, I thought, but on closer inspection.... bind weed, again!! Binds had coiled round branches, forcing them to face the ground distorting the overall shape. Carefully!!! I cut the binds and watched them straighten and stretch heavenward.

Life is sometimes a bind; we feel trapped or distorted. The experience prompts an important question, 'who am I'? St Francis answers, 'what you are looking for, is what is looking'. The answer is found within not without.

'What is looking' (observer - I am) often misidentifies itself with what is seen (observed - I think I am my name, occupation, nationality, achievements, etc). The observer is permanent; the observed, transient. If we identify the permanent (subject) with the transient (predicate) we experience ourselves as 'legion'... pulled in every direction and bound to everything we think we are. The experience is intolerable. I am... is the state of being (Christ within) not a condition of being.

Understanding this, we begin to value the observed correctly. We become selective in choosing what we bind ourselves to. We occupy the state of Simon (to hear). All exterior impressions speak... they influence or lead us. We learn to accept (hear) only those impressions that are conducive to spiritual development and worthy of Christ within. Now we control and are not controlled; we become firm and confident in the life we lead... we enter the state of Peter (rock, faith). We still take in impressions. Those that help us grow, we bind (affirm) to ourselves. Those that would bind us to them, we deny (loose). We have found (been given) the keys of the Kingdom – the interior state. These keys allow us to lock the doors of our soul to exterior harmful impressions or... open them for the world to receive impressions formed by us in Spirit. We have now found what we are looking for... Christ in us, looking.

Memorial of Saint Augustine 28 August

Augustine (354-430), son of Saint Monica, was brought up a Christian, although not baptised. He went on to virtually renounce his Christian faith and lived for 15 years with a mistress by whom he had a son. Augustine went to Rome and Milan where he met Saint Ambrose who baptised him in 386. Returning to Africa, he was ordained in 391 and four years later became Bishop of Hippo.
