From Father Anthony

It was another icy cold morning and still early. Having said my prayers, and with dressing gown wrapped tight, I went downstairs, opened up the church, lit a candle for us all, made some tea and went back upstairs to watch the dawn and listen. A train rumbled and a motor bike roared through the gears: both faded into the distance. Birds greeted the dawn with exquisite song; cathedral bells answered. Someone coughed on the street. I followed the sounds until 'I' was not there; worries, concerns, anxieties, self-preoccupations, for a short while, vanished. Something took it all in... but it was not 'me'. The phone went... oh well!

Jesus said to his disciples, "to you who hear, I say…" Part of discipleship (being a learner) is to listen, to hear. The word used is ἀκούω, akouo… the physical act of listening or hearing. At a deeper level, it means understanding or comprehending what is heard; the ability to discern the Word of God, or the Message of Jesus: not only in the Scriptures and Gospels, but within the whole tapestry of life…. the rhythm or sound (voice) of God in the universe. It requires sensitivity and an absence of self; so that the other can be heard as it is and not as we are.

It is easy to write about *listening* and almost trendy to do so, especially in religious circles. But, beyond trends the reality is not so easy. It requires practice. That is why we are called learners or disciples. In common with Adam we might still be at the stage of *living beings*. Obviously, we begin with the physical, which comes first. But, as St Paul implies, we should not be content to remain as a *living being*: to do so is to remain in a lesser or retarded state, *i.e.* the state governments, institutions, corporations, (*the world*) condition us into. The physical must be for us a springboard into the spiritual; *from living beings* we must become *life giving spirits*. Dying to who we think we are, we emerge as who we truly are... images of God, in Jesus. From disciples we become Apostles. The world is crying out for Apostles; those sent by Jesus with His Message.

For that, we must have heard His Message and must continue to hear and understand it. Then it will be Him that others encounter through us.
