From Father Anthony

Far below the horizon the Sun finally said goodnight and handed over to a very young moon. Shapes and forms faded into the night; sounds became fewer but more pronounced. I sat outside enjoying the air... but no tea! A jet passed overhead, green and red navigation lights flashing; stars twinkled; the silence grew. Yet, the more I listened to it the more I heard, rustles, crackles and squeaks until it became quite noisy. From every direction unwanted sounds, crashed over me like waves preventing me from finding the peace I sought!

Before we attempt to control or master the world; before we attempt to bring to it the peace and serenity it so desperately needs; we must attain selfmastery or control first... or at least have the firm intention of doing so. Otherwise, the blind will lead the blind! This entails paying attention (spiritual practice) to what Saint Paul (Rm 7:22-25) calls the inner person rather than the outer person; the man of spirt (invisible things) rather than the man of sense (physical things). As we grow in spiritual confidence we grow in insight and self-control; our I Am, our centre, who we actually are reflects the mind of Christ (Christ within). We live and work in cooperation with conscience; it becomes the light which directs our daytime life. And this has implications for sleep.

Every night we 'cross over to the other side'; we move from waking consciousness to the consciousness of sleep (dreams) and the effects of the subconscious. We leave the crowd of daytime thoughts and activities and encounter the echo or noise they leave behind. If we are not in control of our Centre it is as if Christ sleeps within; our ability to exercise willpower diminishes; it moves from front to the rear of the brain (cushion) and becomes prey to the unruly 'echoes' or 'terrors' from the day, the darkness of an unformed, uncontrolled conscience.

If our Centre is formed and controlled, it exercises power and authority over anything emanating from the subconscious; it demands and receives order and peace. The light of conscience is carried on into the realm of sleep and 'dispels the terror of the night' (Psalm 91:5) allowing us to enjoy the maximum restorative power of sleep and experience the truth of Psalm 139: 10... "even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast".
