PENTECOST SUNDAY

From Father Anthony...

After thick grey cloud and pouring rain a new day dawned, calm and blue. A light breeze ruffled the trees: sunlight danced on the leaves. It cast long shadows across the lawn and glittered on the dew soaked grass. Sparrows swooped and dived. A pigeon cooed. Blue bellflowers swayed in the green. A baby blackbird, plump and fluffy brown stood beak open and chirping. Its father came bouncing over and, beak to beak, fed it. Beautiful!

Society pays much attention to what we eat and to physical exercise. Yet, little is said of spiritual diet and exercise. The realm of spirit is often spoken of in otherworldly or even magical terms. Conversations about spiritual matters often end with, *'OK, but let's get on with the real world!'* Spirit can be portrayed as alien to and far removed from ordinary life; and what we feed ourselves on, mentally, of no consequence. By contrast, the scriptures reveal the spiritual realm as an integral part of who and what we truly are; *the* reality out of which this world is but a shadow. To be fully human is to be spiritual *(lead you to the complete truth)*. As awakened spiritual beings we are *glorified,* i.e. our true character and origin is revealed to us. Otherwise, we remain 'asleep', living in the fog of an unilluminated sensory world.

Scripture makes much of the *I Am;* that aspect of our being at one with the Father (*issues from the Father*). It is elusive. It can't be seen or understood because all seeing and understanding issue from it; it is the seer not the seen. However, during spiritual practice who we think we are senses that it is seen. It is seen by who we truly are... *I Am.* It dawns on us that who we think we are is not who we actually are. *I Am* is experienced as that which gives us the sense of what we are not (via negativa, Aquinas): and now we begin to waken. Awakening gives us sight of who and what we have made of ourselves and the extent to which we have fallen short of the mark of Love (God). Who we think we are is corrected by the language of love heard from who we actually are (all He tells you). It is as if tongues of understanding burn away the old person and awaken the new.

Status Quo: The current capacity of our churches, our Mass-booking arrangements, hand-sanitising and wearing of face masks remains unchanged. Thank you for continuing to book to attend Mass and to all of our stewards.

Holy Communion: Under one kind only but the priest/deacon is now permitted to announce 'Body of Christ', to each communicant in turn as they come forward. Please keep your mask in place as you reply 'Amen'; lifting your mask only to consume the host. Many thanks.

Readers: are no longer required to wear gloves but we will continue to have only one lay reader per Mass for now. At Masses where the psalm is sung, cantors will sing from a separate place.

Private Prayer: St Osmund's Church will now be open throughout the day, every day for private prayer. On Tuesdays and Thursdays (when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed), if you arrive for private prayer and the church is locked (as it will be when there is no-one present), simply come to the Newman Room (at the back of the Parish Rooms) and we will open the church for you. When visiting for private prayer, there will be no stewards present and so we ask you to sanitise your hands and check-in on arrival (either using the displayed QR code or by writing your name on the list in the entrance), wear a mask whilst in the building and clean the area around your seat before you leave. A spray bottle and cloths will be in the porch for you to use.

Pentecost Sunday - 23 May

On Pentecost Sunday, God breathed the Holy Spirit into the apostles; Jesus had died, risen from the dead and ascended into heaven but they were not left alone. Jesus' followers were afraid and unsure of their future. The Holy Spirit came to comfort them even though Jesus wasn't there to physically comfort them any more.
