OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST KING OF THE UNIVERSE



From Father Anthony

I woke with a sore head and a grumpy mood... prayer was the last thing on my mind! However, I sat, grumps and all, and prayed the Office and Rosary. It was dark outside and full of spectral and skeletal forms... reflecting how I felt. As I went 'round the beads' the last of the stars faded and the emerging sun revealed a beautiful clear, opalescent sky. It rose fast and majestically over rooftops, ever higher, pouring out incandescent light and warmth. Nature picturing our Lord and King', I thought... grumps gone!

The Feast of Christ the King reminds us that Christ in Jesus Rules and Reigns over the Universe regardless of what humanity puts in His place... a sobering thought! And Christ resides within us. The Kingship of Christ therefore is available to all of us through all of us. Today we not only celebrate Jesus, 'the head of the body, the church... the beginning, the firstborn from the dead': we celebrate this essence and character within ourselves. But how? The Gospel gives us a clue.

His Kingship and therefore our participation in it, takes place around the Mystery of the Cross. The cross, as we have said before, also represents us. We have an upright, the spine and shoulders forming a crossbeam upon which our spiritual nature 'hangs' getting all its knowledge through the senses. It is this spiritual nature we must develop. The Cross stands on Golgotha, a representation of the mind or thought centre. Most of us will be aware of two other crosses either side of us, so to speak; the forces of light and the forces of darkness (good thief and bad thief). These two poles we must balance because there is always a tendency to travel to one extreme or the other becoming unbalanced. The balance point is often referred to as the True Light, represented by the true Cross at the centre, reigning over all (remember, light on its own blinds; utter darkness also stops you from seeing. Balance the two and you have form, direction and sight).

Coming *to know oneself* is not intended as a form of narcissism, self-glory or self-preoccupation. It is becoming aware of the light and the dark within us. This very awareness, the seer of the seen, is the space where Christ is experienced. In the space of awareness, Christ reigns through us over the world.
