ORDINARY TIME WEEK 25(A)

From Father Anthony

I marvelled at the weather for this time of year as the Jalopy purred along. Several points West the sun was napping on a pile of fluffy cloud, hot and bright. Otherwise the sky was clear blue. Over traffic lights and bypassing signs to Whiteparish we went, rolling green fields to the left, lines of trees to the right and rich farm smells in the air. The road climbed gently and then gave onto beautiful wide vistas with Salisbury, a tiny clump, in the distance; its finger pointing to the heavens. The man behind, who had been pushing to get past me, found his opportunity and roared down the duel carriageway. Later we were both caught in the bottleneck to get into town.... 'The first shall be paid the same as the last', I thought!

Recent Gospel passages have made much of, 'carrying one's cross'; of 'denying oneself'; of 'entering into a constant state of forgiveness'. There has been a sense of 'clearing the decks': of 'discarding the old to make way for the new'. Older spiritual traditions refer to this as 'the Work' or 'the Way'. Modern terminology refers to it as preparing for Spiritual Consciousness or the Christ Consciousness, i.e. becoming as Christ is. The Gospel parable, this week, subtly points to the reward for engaging in 'the Work'.

If the vineyard represents the Kingdom of Heaven; and if the Kingdom of Heaven is found within: and if the Householder (oikodespoté: οἰκοδεσπότης, Master of the House) is our higher being: then this higher being has to continually go (daybreak, noon, afternoon and evening) deep within to form the Kingdom. We have to go into all areas or aspects of our lives (the hired men) and call them forward; making sure they work towards a common end. No one area is more important than another and which comes first or last is irrelevant; until they all come together they are nothing; together they are everything, i.e. all areas of our being must be conformed to the Christ state, which is the Kingdom of Heaven. Until this happens we experience separation and dysfunction; once it happens we experience oneness or unity. We experience ourselves as the infinite State of Christ whose Being is eternal with the Father and the Holy Spirit: it has neither beginning nor end. We have returned to our heavenly homeland... but on earth. What a reward!
