# 4TH SUNDAY OF EASTER (B) GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

# From Father Anthony...

Ferocious birdsong announced her arrival; gangsters circled overhead. Mrs Cat sashayed across the lawn, slumped down, stretched elegantly, and looked imperiously down her back... tail swishing. I sat outside with a sandwich and some tea. The garden swayed in a warm breeze: green limbs splashed with colour. With each season it has presented a different face; form and content has changed. But, however difficult to define, its essence has remained the same; it has an underlying character all of its own.

When Moses asked God (Exodus 3-13) what His name was, the reply came, 'I Am that I Am' (ehyeh aser ehyeh - אַהָּיָה אָיָטֶר אֶהָיָה) Effectively, God referred to Himself as the first person, past, present and future tense of the verb, 'to be'. His name is 'I Am'. He is pure unconditioned, unformed Being. He is the Absolute; that, out of which all else emerges as form and content. Yet, He is greater than and distinct from the sum of all the parts. We share in the essence and mysterious name of 'I Am'. Every time we say 'I Am', this, that or the other, we use His name as ours; we share in His being. It is our unique personal name. No one else can say 'I Am' of us: only of themselves. 'I Am' is a deeper experience of oneness with Christ within.

Very often we confuse 'I Am' with form or content, e.g. I am... hungry, I am... happy, I am... big. We define ourselves as form or content. This is an error because the sense of 'I Am' remains when form and content change. What we define ourselves as is the hired man in this week's Gospel. It does not have the power to transform or heal us because it is a derivative of what we truly are... 'I Am'. How we describe ourselves is a function of what we truly are... but not who we truly are. Change your race, name, occupation... you are still 'I Am'. This 'I Am' (Christ) is the shepherd... it is the door, the light. It is who we truly are... as essence. It is the place from which we see ourselves seeing and understanding. It is formless; it is pure awareness. It is the place where we share Oneness with our Creator. The more we rest in the Oneness of 'I Am' the more we reflect Him.

# FEAST OF SAINT CATHERINE OF SIENA - 29 APRIL

Catherine Benincasa, born in Siena at a date that remains uncertain, was favoured with visions from the age of seven. Becoming a tertiary of the Dominican Order, she acquired great influence by her life of prayer as well as by the spread of her spiritual writings. Her continual appeals for civil peace and reform of the Church make her one of the leading figures of the fourteenth century. She died in Rome on April 29, 1380. #### The Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist

The real presence of Christ in the Eucharist is a doctrine – an official teaching of the Catholic Church – and a profound mystery. With the words of consecration, the whole of Christ is truly present – Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity – under the appearances of bread and wine.
