From Father Anthony

The Brown Sparrows performed an aerobatic display as I sat looking out of my bedroom window... tea in hand, of course. A seagull flapped white in the distance against the green of trees; two pigeons cooed to one another. A stiff breeze set nature dancing, but the sky was grey and sullen, not letting the sun out to play. Mrs Cat sashayed across the lawn imperiously. For a moment I saw everything as whole; the garden, church, rooftops, sky and desultory sounds; it felt very peaceful.

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. The word for peace is $eir\acute{e}n\acute{e}$ ($eip\acute{n}v\eta$). Apart from health and general welfare it also has the meaning of being joined together or whole. In a world of confusion, dysfunction, lies, deception, manipulations and false promises many of us long for a sense of truth and wholeness... for ourselves and society too.

Jesus tells us to keep His Word if we love him. Our ordinary human love for Him must transform into a quality of love where we prefer to be what *He is* rather than *what we are*, i.e. abandon our wants and needs in order to be one with His Being so as to encounter the way He thinks and feels; participating in his creative ability, His Word, (*If you love me you will keep my word*). This entails *work*; it is the work of being surrendered to His will; of finding and becoming Him who already resides deep in our being (*within*). If we do this we will inhabit His Mind; the very mind through which all came to be! We will experience the wholeness of his Mind, understand how all the component parts come together to form a variegated whole; we will understand how we fit into it and how others do too. This wholeness *is* peace - there is nothing outside of it, nothing to disturb it, nothing before or after it. The world *cannot give this*.

I mentioned *work*. It has nothing to do with strain, effort or achievement. It is simple prayerful observation of who and what we think we are; our thoughts, feelings, prejudices, attachments; but mirrored against the experience of God within. This mirroring enables us to see what is not of God and let it go; what remains is God... nothing more. Peace.

ASSISTED SUICIDE

Archbishop-elect John Sherrington, Lead Bishop for Life Issues, has made a statement after the Private Member's Bill seeking to legalise assisted suicide entered its Report Stage on Friday, 16 May 2025. Within his statement he reiterates the Catholic Church's principled objection to the bill as well as raising some serious concerns. He concludes by urging all people of goodwill to take action by praying and contacting their MP to raise awareness about the irreversible harm this bill would cause. FROM CHAPEL TO CHURCH - A HISTORY OF CATHOLICS IN SALISBURY C.1700 - C.1860 Our website's main menu now includes a really interesting new section on our parish history. Here you will find a paper authored by parishioner Graham Brown detailing the history of Catholics in Salisbury from about 1700-1860. In time, further insights into Catholics in the region will be added.

The first paper, *From Chapel to Church*, deals with the period when Catholics initially worshipped in a private chapel. Later, during the early and mid-19th century, three successive public chapels were established. During these early years, the Catholic population was only 15-20 people, but by the mid19th century, it had risen ten-fold, and since they had now gained greater freedom, they were able to build the Church of St Osmund.
