From Fr Anthony...

Inky blobs drifted across a ruffled sky. Blackbirds danced on the lawn and sparrows swayed on the feeder. Red and copper coloured leaves swirled in the breeze and collected along the edges of the path. The garden looks bedraggled. It is adapting: harmonising with a change of season. It has bathed in moonlight and baked in the sun; it has suffered drought, drenching and aired under clear blue skies. Nature is pliable, open to change. I'm not very pliable, I don't like change and I adapt under protest. I'm often dysfunctional and disharmonious. I don't fear the unknown... I fear leaving the known. I want life on my terms. I like the status quo. Ring any bells?

Jesus' reply to the Pharisees (that part of our nature concerned with the status quo, not letting go) holds a key to harmony and understanding. Again, the key is Love. Not our caramelised, romantic love but, $\dot{\alpha}\gamma\alpha\pi\dot{\alpha}\omega$, (agapao), 'to prefer' what God prefers; to live as God lives. It means harmonising one's heart, soul and mind with His; choosing His choices. It is an *intention* to see and feel the world His way... the way of the *Giver*. The *intention* is paramount. It is the *intention* to seek the thought of the *Giver* behind everything... regardless of the pleasure received or not. We 'look beyond' outcomes (*life events*) and harmonise with the unchanging, stable thought, *behind life*: God, the origin. Living with the Origin we experience stability amid a changing world. Fear and disappointment recede: we are freed from the desperation of seeking but never finding. How is it done in practice...?

...by forming an *intention* to love the 'unknown God', in our neighbour... whom we can know and experience. Regardless of what we receive, pleasurable or otherwise, our *intention* shifts from pleasing self (*love of self*) to pleasing our neighbour (as ourselves). Knowing our own needs intimately forms the basis of *intending* the same for him. Our intention is always for his betterment regardless of what we receive from him. We receive from him so that he has the pleasure of giving. What we would not countenance for ourselves we will not countenance for him. Selfishness gives way to altruism as we align with and experience the nature of the Creator; *the giver*.

To the earth-bound mind this is 'foolishness'. To the spiritual heart it is the way to an eternal season.

Carlo Acutis, who died of leukemia at the age of 15 in 2006, was beatified on Saturday 10 October in the town of Assisi, Italy. Acutis, described by the Vatican as a "computer genius with a love for the Eucharist" is believed to be the youngest contemporary person who has been beatified.
