# LENT WEEK 1(A)

## From Father Anthony

I sat outside, tea in hand. The garden was a mass of dull, bare, bent forms. Low down there were signs of new life; daffodils, crocuses and snowdrops. The promise of Spring scented the air. As if to celebrate, the Brown Sparrows made aerial displays and dived in and out of the hedge while the Gunslinger sang his little heart out. I felt the tired, bent old ways that make up my life: and the underlying desire to let them go for something brighter more life giving. As if on que the sun burst through the clouds!

The Saints speak about three stages in spiritual development; the *purgative*, *illuminative and unitive way*. There comes a stage when, for whatever reasons, we challenge the values, beliefs and conditioning that make up our life. We become aware of how dull, bent and bare our lives may have become and what needs to transform. This is the beginning of the purgative way. In becoming aware of the life we are leading *(observing and feeling it)* we can free ourselves from it, i.e. we can *fast* from the diet of thoughts, feeling and actions that have made up our lives and that inhibit our spiritual growth.

Jesus was led by the Spirit out into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. The word for tempted can also mean tested. The root word for 'devil' diabállō, means "to slander, accuse, defame" one who condemns to sever a relationship. During Lent we are invited to go into the wilderness of our hearts and test to see what in our lives is severing our relationship with God.

Turn these stones into bread. Bread is life giving; are we trying to find what is lifegiving in a diet of material goods rather than the spirit? Worship me and I'll give you all of this: are we worshiping material images of God? God can only be known as unknown (the wilderness is the experience of God). God is not the image we have of God. Throw yourself down: Most of us day dream about how life could be! But God is found in the moment, in the reality we are living. Anything else is testing God to be where He is not, i.e. trying to make Him in our image. Purgation can be unpleasant but it brings the great reward of Illumination (Understanding) and then... Unity with God.



Cost for three days/two nights is £160 (£80 per night, per person based on two people sharing a room) or £240 (£120 per person, per night for a single room), there is the option to go one day early if you so wish. All meals are included from their 'Five Star' rated kitchen which has earned a good reputation for delicious cuisine freshly prepared on the premises. The centre is well set up to cater for those with mobility difficulties and families.
