From Father Anthony

The view was spectacular. I tucked the car off road and took it all in. Below, between rolling folds of dense green, swans glided across a lake. Ducks quacked and splashed: birdsong echoed over the hills. A lady stood before an easel sketching a stone house, along with turrets and a church spire all nestling in between the fields opposite. The road meandered down and climbed away into a forest. White puffy clouds drifted across deep blue obscuring the sun, losing their form and density in a glorious white haze... the spiritual obscured by the physical but illuminating it!

Periodically we may do well to remind ourselves that we are spiritual beings incarnated into physical bodies. Our true nature is spiritual; we hail from the realm of spirit. This is not to say that we reject the physical, secular world; not at all. We awaken or *remember* the spirit we are in order to bring spirit into the world so as to transform the world. Like the sun shining behind a cloud we illuminate not only ourselves but the world we live in. This is a very real task; our ministry, in fact. All too often we remain clones of the world we live in, confirming its dense, erroneous ways but never illuminating it. We suffer, ourselves, as a consequence.

Lazarus in the tomb represents the human state devoid of spirit... a form of animated death. A state where thought is limited to what we can see, hear, taste, touch or smell. Yet the world is a function of spirit and can only fulfil itself by returning to its homeland. As St Pauls says, 'The first man Adam became a living being; the last Adam a life-giving spirit. i.e. we arrive in the world as a sensory, animated being but must become a life-giving spirit... here on earth.

The secular world has great problems with this and can diminish it, ridicule it, and provide all manner of distractions to stop us *remembering* it; because, ultimately, *'the world'* is threatened by it. But, there is no threat only the offer of life. Just as physical eyes can look upon beautiful scenery, spiritual eyes must look upon Christ. He is the Radiance that will illuminate us and raise us spiritually... not *out of* but *into* the world. During Lent, especially, let's practice letting the worldly decrease so that He, Spirit, may increase.

PASSIONTIDE -THE VEILING OF IMAGES

You will notice something different when you come to church this weekend: the violet veils over the statues and images alert us that we are entering into Passiontide, the most sacred days of the year. We are fasting from our usual expressions of joy and festival: less music, no flowers, and now a purple pall over the colourful statues. The church is uniting herself to Christ's suffering and death. It may seem counterintuitive to cover up the crucifixes just as we're focussing our attention on the Cross: but this ancient tradition reminds us that Jesus' divinity was hidden under a veil of human weakness and pain, and causes us to long even more deeply for the Resurrection. At Easter, the veils will be removed: both literally in church, and figuratively from our own hearts, when Christ gives us the joy and vibrant colour of His risen life.

Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary - The solemnity of the Annunciation on Saturday marks one year since Pope Francis consecrated Russia and Ukraine to the Blessed Virgin Mary in St. Peter's Basilica with a prayer asking for peace in the world. On 22 March, the pope recalled his historic act of consecration and called on parish communities and prayer groups to annually renew the Marian consecration. HOLY REDEEMER CONSULTATION

Last weekend at all Masses, an announcement was made that a parish-wide consultation about the future of The Most Holy Redeemer Church was to be launched. During the week, Fr Anthony emailed all registered parishioners the following message:

We are currently preparing for a future where fewer priests will serve larger areas with the possibility of diminishing congregations and income. Our parish has three church buildings within 2 miles of each other and the roof at Holy Redeemer requires extensive essential repairs if it is to remain open. Therefore, we must ask the question whether our mission in this city is best served by raising sufficient funds to repair and maintain this building. If not, should we redevelop the land in order to provide an income for the future? It goes without saying that this would be a very difficult and sad decision to have to take, given the fondness which many of us share for this beautiful and community-built church.

The salient facts are:

The church is used twice-weekly for a congregation of between thirty to ninety persons.

Projected essential repair costs are between £K500 - £1m.

Even if we could raise the money (which is doubtful), there is a compelling moral argument as to whether we should, weighing cost against strategic necessity and projected usage.

Closing the church would cause inconvenience and sadness but there are two other churches to choose from within a short distance.

With fewer priests and diminishing congregations - and therefore diminishing finance - redevelopment of the land may eventually provide an income for the future mission of the Church in Salisbury.

If the church does close, the Saturday Evening Mass will migrate to one of our other two churches.

Permission to conduct this consultation was granted by Bishop Declan on 7 February 2023 and the final decision will rest with him. It is my hope that through a period of discernment, prayer and dialogue we can provide him with the best possible evidence to inform the decision-making process.
