From Father Anthony

It was a balmy afternoon. Cannock Chase unwound into the distance, a patchwork of mustard yellow and Country Bus green. The sun shone brightly. Shadows dappled the landscape as clouds floated across the sky. A hint of farmyard hung on the breeze: a cow mooed in the distance. I let the sun burn my face, breathed deeply and let nature fill my senses: languid and comely, powerful and unrelenting... heavenly! Out of the blue, I thought, 'there is only Christ; many roads lead to Him but there is only Him. Don't confuse the road with the destination'. Maybe it was guilt at succumbing to nature!

Jesus came to Caesarea Philippi. Caesarea, *Kaisareia, Kaioápɛia,* comes from *Kaisar, Kaīoap*, meaning Caesar, a Roman Emperor. Philip, *Philippos,* Φίλιππος means *horse loving;* spiritually it often refers to the active mind; that which carries us through life. Combined with Caesar we get a sense of the power of personality, seeking its own praises and glory; being king in its own life and attempting to dominate others. Last week Jesus entered into and drew Faith out the *yapping mind:* this week He will probe deeper.

Christ comes to our *personality*: who and what we think we are. As with Peter, so with us, He asks, 'who do you say I Am?' If we are wrapped up in our own personality we may grudgingly allow Him the dignity of being 'another great personality', (John the Baptist, or a prophet). If the gift of Faith (preferring what God prefers) has taken root; if we have controlled in us that which seeks personal praise, gratification and dominion over others; if we are dying to ourselves; then, there will less of who we think we are and more of who we truly are. God will reveal His Nature in us! The world, flesh and blood, can't do this. Then we become channels of His Grace: we recognise Christ in us as us; personality gives way to individuality. God builds His Kingdom in and through us. He is King... not personality nor Caesar.

Now our spiritual ministry on earth can begin. Just as trees soak up carbon, we will soak up, what in the world and our own lives *misses the mark (Sin);* we will bind it. Having bound it we will loose the world and ourselves into the balance, freedom and love of God... heaven on earth and earth in heaven.

PARISH UPDATE FROM FATHER ANTHONY

Dear Friends.

I hope you are well and enjoying the summer. If you have been on holiday I hope you are refreshed and enjoyed it: if you are going or are about to go away, I wish you all the very best... come back refreshed, safe and sound.

A fair amount has taken place this year, not to mention the roof & ceiling at St Osmund's, pigeons in the belfry, the refurbishment of St Gregory's Church, work in St Gregory's Hall and permission granted by Bishop Declan to close Holy Redeemer. Onwards and upwards - so I would like to update you, as promised, on the following:

- i. Holy Redeemer Proposals are being developed for the use of the land at Holy Redeemer. We are waiting on the Diocese: as soon as I have something concrete I'll come back to you.
- ii. Parish Centre I propose to create a Parish Centre at St Elizabeth House, Exeter Street to be known as the Parish of Saint Osmund, Parish Centre: obviously, as a merged parish, this includes all our communities from Whaddon, Downton, Holy Redeemer, Saint Gregory's and St Osmund's the title simply reflects the name of the merged parish and not the church of the same name. The present tenants are departing and there is an opportunity to reclaim that part of the premises they rented from us. Exactly how and what it is used for will need to be explored and refined but its uses may include youth work, the elderly, parish lunches, coffee mornings, First Holy Communion preparation and Confirmation preparation... and it has plenty of parking! This Parish Centre will be in addition to our current use of that part of the building known as St Elizabeth Hall which we currently hire out on a business footing to generate income for the parish and will continue to do so.

If you feel you could assist in developing the aims, objectives and uses of the Centre – especially its management and administration - I will invite you to attend a facilitated workshop, venue and date to be announced: for now, I'd be very grateful if you would consider ways in which you could assist and be a part of the process of establishing this Centre and get in touch if you'd like to be involved.

iii. Youth

- a. Two people have shown interest in becoming our parish youth worker. This is very good news. We will conduct interviews and I'll let you know the outcome.
- b. I propose to trial an afterschool club on Sep 20, 27 & Oct 4, 11. It is aimed at primary-aged children who would come along with their parents to St Osmund's Church Hall for about 40mins directly after school finishes. It will be a chance for me to get to know the children and introduce them to various aspects of the sacraments, church life and basic church teaching nothing too onerous. It will also be a chance for parents to get together over tea or coffee. Parents, please let me know what you think of this idea.
- c. Following the after-school trial I will be inviting those Confirmed earlier this year along with those of the two preceding years to a series of get-togethers on Oct 18, 25 & Nov 08, 15. Again, this will be a trial and a chance to socialise, explore further and expand on the life of youth in our churches; it might lead to youth Masses and a series of youth clubs!
- iv. Parish Pastoral Council Our Pastoral Council will reform in the Autumn. Details to follow soon. Love and prayers
