From Father Anthony

I rose early to pray. It was dark; Moonlight dappled rooftops. A car groaned in the distance; something rustled in the garden. I sat still, felt a cool breeze through the window, eased my tummy and contemplated the Trinity... the ineffable Father reflected in and as the Son; the Son gazing back into the Father, seeing The Everything and The Nothing. Son and Father bonded together in and by the Holy Spirit, the Son bringing The Everything forth in The Nothing... through Him all came to be. And then, as usual, emptiness and darkness! I trusted that God was Present and settled into the liminal space fringing the emptiness.

Lord teach us to pray. The word translated as teach conveys the meaning of to cause to learn. Very often prayer is a jumble of vocal or sub vocal words; a babble. Hence, do not babble as the pagans do. It is rooted in The Word yet beyond words. It is something we have to learn; and someone has to cause us to learn it. The Gospel hints at some aspects of this learning. We must be persistent regardless of how we feel. We must ask, seek and knock... trusting that we will be answered without necessarily knowing how we will be answered. Yet, this persistence, asking, seeking and knocking is not prayer. Prayer is more the awareness or attitude at back of these; characterised by the relationship of a child to a Father. It is about putting ourselves in a position where God can be God in our lives. Ultimately, prayer is not about what we ask of or what we do for God but what God does for us, in us; a loving Father holding and teaching His child. Is this what we have to learn? Is prayer, possibly less about words and concepts and more about a trusting attitude of mind and heart?

Jesus was praying in a certain place. What it actually says is, 'And it came to pass in His being in a certain place praying'. In His Being in a certain place! Have we found that certain place yet where we can settle into our Being, there to allow Him to cause us to learn (teach us)? If not already, then we must find that place, give Him that time. Expect nothing; expect everything... but let Him do it as we rest in His arms.
