## Ordinary Time Week 22(C)

## From Father Anthony

The sun climbed out of the East flooding the room with light. I lounged in bed reading and sipping tea. It was seaside fresh and blue as a cornflower. Too good to laze! A shower, sandals, shorts and a T shirt later found me on the beach. Waves frothed and splashed. Gulls hovered and dived checking to see if I had any food. They flocked onto golden windswept sand with piercing cries. But, it was a lame gull with a gammy leg that caught my attention. Poor thing!

A spiritual maxim states: 'the higher always bows down to the lower'. We have spoken about this before but, spiritually, its importance cannot be overstated. Without humility there can be little spiritual growth. Humility neither overestimates nor underestimates itself. It knows itself as the ground (humus, earth) from which God, creation and others, without whom it could neither exist nor survive, are understood. It requires self-awareness and self-knowledge.

For this we must regularly *enter the house of the Pharisee on a Sabbath!* At one level this refers to a state of mind where we honestly appraise our thought, emotion and action. The *Pharisaic aspect* of mind looks to *form* and *utility* rather than *essence*. It values the letter rather than the spirit of the law. It confuses itself as author rather than authored. It views meditation, observation and rest *(a Sabbath)* as inaction, suspicious and a waste of time. Sole reliance on this aspect of mind deforms our character *(the man with dropsy)*.

A Sabbath is an aspect of mind that is conscious of the perfection of all things in God; we grasp the essence of things; we understand we are a part and not the whole; that the world does not revolve around us. We see ourselves in our place. We observe how arrogant, self-opinionated, self-entitled, intolerant and domineering we may be... we encounter the lame side of our nature. This encounter, like seeing the lame gull, should fill us with compassion for what we observe and a desire to transform it. Without compassion for ourselves we are unlikely to have understanding and compassion for others. When the worldly and spiritual aspects of our nature (*Pharisee and Sabbath*) integrate or are wedded (marriage feast), humility is born. Understanding how it emerges from a lower nature our higher nature gives thanks to it (bows down) and rules it with firmness but compassion.
