# LENT WEEK 2(B)

## From Father Anthony...

Early morning, well before dawn. Birdsong sweetened the silence: Cathedral bells quartered it. I pounded dark edged, inky streets. Shadows clung to indistinct forms: wraithlike figures waited at a bus stop. Men in sleeping bags huddled along a covered area. In the distance a cock crowed and, as if on call, the sun began to diffuse its light through the morning murk. The world was given shape, definition and colour.... it was transfigured. Now I could see what I was looking at; what to gaze on and what to avoid... and narrowly missed a pot hole!

During Lent we are invited to enter the wilderness of our inner being. We are urged to become aware (the wisest use of our worldly consciousness) of our undisciplined, free roaming and disconnected thoughts; and then, form the desire and intention to move beyond them. Through ordinary awareness, we see who and what we are not, (negative); which is not the same as knowing who and what we are (positive). This week we learn that the desire and intention to move beyond what we are not is a prelude to a much fuller, deeper and positive experience. It opens the way to recognising our very Essence (Jesus). This Essence unites ordinary awareness (Peter) with our soul (James) and Spirit (John). Jesus takes us up the mountain (realm of Spirit) to reveal who He is; who we are.

With body, soul and spirit unified, the truth of our being begins to dawn; it emerges out of the gloom of the wilderness; we experience wholeness and purpose rather than disparateness and confusion. Experiencing ourselves as Essence (*Jesus*) we are elevated, 'transfigured'. We experience ourselves as a fusion of the Love of God (*Jesus*), the Wisdom of God (*Moses*) and the Power of God (*Elijah*). As we accept this, we recognise who and what we truly are... the beloved daughter or son in whom the Father is well pleased. This experience brings enlightenment and happiness (good to be here). Having glimpsed and experienced Love, Wisdom and Power we must now exercise them, i.e. embody them, come from them, (let us make three tents – tent is a sign of embodiment). We experience resurrection as a present reality (they discussed rising from the dead). Having embodied our 'transfiguration',
