From Father Anthony...

It was a warm, bright, day. I left the narrow streets of Salisbury, skirted Wilton, nodded at Stonehenge and was soon across the Plain. It looked marble bare; grey-brown patches sown together over ancient curves. Red flags warned in the wind. Military vehicles lumbered over high ground. With plenty of time to spare I took a nostalgic detour. I nudged down the lane and met a horse and rider... barely room for the two of us! I cut the engine. Tranquil and sedate the Chestnut Mare squeezed past with gentle grace; the rider looked down, poised and relaxed. We exchanged greetings and went our ways.

I thought of Jesus riding into Jerusalem. Last week we saw how reliance on our *sense nature* has to be held in check. The mind, like a skittish horse, must be mastered and controlled (*Philip - power*). Mastered and controlled, the mind is like *the colt that no one has ridden* – it no longer runs wild! Now it is in a position to recognise its Godlike, spiritual nature. Our relevant faculties (*disciples*) can release it (*untie the colt*) to be of service to the Lord (*our true being – Christ within, the 'I'*). We now begin the journey of entering our spiritual nature, (*ride the colt into Jerusalem*). Jerusalem means City of Peace, *the centre of our being*. Our path is littered with the many thoughts and feelings that have tied us down; there is joy and liberation as we 'ride over them'.

Having recognised and experienced our spiritual nature we must 'operate' from it because sense nature... 'fights back'. It is noisy, questions relentlessly, finds fault and deals in guilt and death. It prefers *sense* (Barabbas) over *spirit* (Jesus). Spiritual nature, by contrast, is confident, quiet: when questioned, it simply reminds *sense nature* that it is a derivative of and therefore subservient to, spirit (King of the Jews). Spirit and *sense nature* cannot meaningfully speak to one another: one is real, the other a shadow we have confused with reality. One is ruled by sensory impressions; the other rules and manifests them and their effects. The sentence of death demanded by *sense nature* results in its own death... the death of one being the resurrection and ascension of the other... i.e. the ending of what is former so as to bring about what naturally follows. With the death of little 'me', Christ can rise within.



PALM SUNDAY - 28 MARCH

There is both great joy and terrible sorrow associated with this day, the Sunday that begins Holy Week, the Sunday that portends the crucifixion of Our Lord. It is a time of despair, perplexity and contradiction. The very people who applaud Christ's entrance into Jerusalem that morning, shouting out "Hosanna" and words of adoration will, within a week, be crying, "Crucify Him." They will go from acclaiming Him as the new King of Israel to urging His life be traded in favour of a convicted criminal; they will first praise Him and then mock Him. Even friends entering Jerusalem at His side will desert Jesus. All this discord will take place during one week beginning on what we call Palm Sunday.
