PENTECOST SUNDAY

From Father Anthony

It was the end of another long day... not that I could have told you what I'd achieved! I made a sandwich, some tea then flopped outside. The Brown Sparrows, fresh from aerobatic practice, were taking a bath. Wings fluttering, water splashing they chatted away in delightful song. Traffic rumbled: a door slammed. It was moist and warm: a gust of wind swirled through the trees and rained down blossom like confetti. It reminded me of a recent wedding. We were trapped inside the church because of heavy rain but decided to throw confetti anyway, as the lovely couple walked up and down the aisles. For a moment it looked like little tongues of fire were raining down on us all. What a celebration, what fun!

We may be locked away in our hearts resisting the vagaries of the world (*the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews*). The positions we adopt towards others and the whole mechanism of society, along with the effects of our upbringing, might keep us locked inside ourselves. But notice, it says that Jesus stood among them... no mention of doors being opened! Into our closed hearts, along with our fears and worries, stands Jesus. We need to recognise Him: for that, Peace is necessary (*My peace I give you*). Peace is present with Jesus. So how do we unlock it?

Through forgiveness (whose sin you forgive). When we look beyond how others fall short of the mark (sin): when we do not define them by their presenting behaviour or opinions: when we attempt to see the image of God they are... then they will experience being 'seen' or forgiven (to give beforehand). They experience the peace of truth... and so do we. Offering forgiveness means we are in a state of forgiveness ourselves; we experience what we offer! When we retain it (whose sins you retain) we are in a state of retention - which is the very problem, an example of the closed doors! Therefore, we must forgive. Forgiveness is not an option: it is a necessity for their sake and ours.

We recognise Jesus by entering into and being one with Him in His State; forgiveness. Forgiveness brings peace to the giver and the receiver; it is forgiveness that we must rain down on humanity like tongues of fire so that life becomes a celebration... and fun.
