From Father Anthony

Thick snowflakes fell from swollen dense grey clouds bruised with mauve. The town looked magnificent in its white mantle; I couldn't help thinking *never in all his glory was Solomon so arrayed (Mt 6.29)*. We made our way to the sea front. The promenade was deserted. Occasional gulls floated by in silence. Waves roared and thundered as they exploded against the sea wall sending spume high into the air. Sunlight blinked over the orangey rim of the clouds and glinted off the sea. It was awe inspiring; I felt insignificant in the face of such power, majesty and beauty.

We spoke about the practice of coming into the presence of Christ. This Presence will 'take us up the mountain' (an eponymous metaphor for *'teaching in spirit'*). This teaching is not found in books or classrooms. His Presence effects a change in our minds and hearts which we only become aware of afterwards. We look back and realise that the 'landscape of our mind' has changed revealing its simple poverty. It is not so much that we become aware of His majesty but that we realise how beggarly in spirit we actually are in the face of it (blessed are the poor in spirit... the word for poor means beggarly). We realise that no matter who or what we are we cannot 'boast' (hold our heads up high) other than to boast that, in our being, we are a gift of God. I may be the greatest scientist, thinker, artist, entrepreneur or whatever: none of it did I create myself. It was all given (enabled) by God. Even the ability to refine the gift for better or worse, is itself God's gift (free will). In the face of such awesomeness, our human spirit feels small. And so it should, for so it is. It is God's gift that we 'boast' about as St Paul mentions ('boast' means, 'hold ones heads up high'). We never look up to or down upon anyone but, in awe, see only God in them.

We have said many times that prayer is an exchange of wishes where we come to accept God's wishes for us. It is also an experience of *'going up the mountain'* where in the presence of His Divine majesty we experience our own small beggarliness... in order to experience, at the same time, our true magnificence as a reflection of His Glory.

RITE OF ELECTION - SATURDAY 25 FEBRUARY

On the first Saturday of Lent, as at the start of every Lent, our diocesan family gathers together at Clifton Cathedral to celebrate the Rite of Election, where those who are journeying towards becoming part of our Catholic community are presented to Bishop Declan. Here, family and friends, sponsors and godparents, join with those preparing for Baptism (catechumens) and those preparing to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church (candidates). There are two important elements to this Rite - a sending and a receiving. We, the parish, 'send' those planning to join our Church at Easter. This is our public pronouncement that they are ready to enter a covenant relationship through participation in the sacramental life of the Church. Those who are 'sent' can then be received: the Bishop accepts the parish community's judgement, receives them and invites them to enter their names in the Book of the Elect. This year, we are delighted to be 'sending' 5 adults to Clifton Cathedral from our parish and all parishioners are welcome to travel to Clifton Cathedral for this liturgy. Salisbury Justice & Peace Group is part of the National Justice & Peace network an organisation within the Catholic Church. Groups work on 5 priorities which are the 5 Ps:

P1: Poverty & Inequality: To end poverty and hunger, in all its forms and dimensions.

P2: Planet: To protect the planet "so it can support the needs of the present and future generations." Nearly every day we are seeing just how connected – and fundamental – climate change is to global development. P3: Person (Human Rights)

P4: Politics (not party politics): Campaigning / lobbying on issues of concern

P5: Peace: Promoting peaceful and just societies. Conflict threatens human rights; those living in fragile and conflict-affected states account for 80 percent of the extreme poor.

There are various actions we can take to address these issues such as: Raising funds for CAFOD (P1) or visiting your MP about an issue or concern (P4). We all have issues about which we are concerned, we must not look away and hope someone else will fix them, they might include the destruction of the Rain Forest in South America (P2) or the plight of people in Ukraine (P5).

You have freedom of speech and you are informed by the media, surely you must make your voice heard and make your life count.

So lets try to make a positive difference in small steps. The population of the world is 8 billion (8,000,000,000), if just 1 percent (80,000,000) of the planet both cared and took action, the small steps would turn into a giant leap and the world would be a better place.
