From Fr Anthony...

I lounged upstairs watching Motor Racing (boys and their toys! I know). Inky blue-black clouds billowed menacingly outside; rain tattooed the window pane. A siren cut the air: blue light flashed off the ceiling. The room was gloomy, indistinct. Then the sun found a gap: shafts of golden sunlight streamed in creating a stretched checker board of light and dark. I ran downstairs, into the garden knowing what I might find; sharp splinters of rain stung my face. There it was. A stick of seaside candy rock; solid striped colours bowed over the houses... a rainbow!

This magical assembly of hues and tones, shined against a background of dark sky. As foreground it claimed my attention. When it dissipated, motor racing became foreground again... in I went. The contrast between background and foreground is constant; foreground always claiming attention. What I never 'see', is the place from which I see everything... me. This 'me', the 'observer', is known, spiritually, as the 'wilderness', or 'desert'... (a lonely place). It is the point from which I see all that I am or think I am. The Greek word is eremos (ἔρημος)... eremitical or hermit: one who seeks solitude so as to encounter Christ. In this encounter I do not focus on Christ as on the rainbow. Rather, I share the same space with Christ from which all is seen... including myself. We are one not two... yet both distinct!

In Oneness He experiences my life; I His. I can also see myself from Him. I see how I let time slip by; my reluctance to move on, always returning to the old way (towns and villages). He urges me, through correct use of my faculties (disciples), to feed the multitude of earthbound thoughts, (give them something yourself). He shows me how to situate my thoughts in time (seated on the grass). He asks and I bring Him what I have: not loaves and fishes but, five senses and the dual natured soul. With Him I rise in consciousness (eyes to heaven). He now works through my faculties and pulls my earth-bound nature apart. He multiplys who and what I am to higher levels until the spiritual being I am emerges after the long sleep. My thoughts are raised in consciousness (fully fed) because my raised faculties operate from the world of spirit (twelve baskets left over). I am now whole and restored.

MEMORIAL OF SAINT DOMINIC 8 AUGUST

On a journey through France with his bishop, Dominic came face to face with the then virulent Albigensian heresy at Languedoc. Albigensian belief was dualistic: they saw the universe as a struggle between good and evil, in which the physical, tangible world was inherently corrupt, evil, the creation of Satan, and the spiritual universe was the realm of the good God. Dominic sensed the need for the Church to combat this heresy, and was commissioned to be part of the preaching crusade against it. His fellow preachers gradually became a community, and in 1215 Dominic founded a religious house at Toulouse, the beginning of the Order of Preachers or Dominicans.
