# ADVENT WEEK 1 (B)

# From Father Anthony

I made my way up Exeter Street, past St Osmund's School, through the underpass and up onto the road bridge. Traffic rumbled, a hooter honked, the Avon rolled swiftly below. It had burst its banks and formed lakes upon the marshland. Swans glided upon the trespassing water, heads bowed majestically. A man came along eyes glued to his phone... I only just got out of his way in time! He ploughed by, never looked up, never aware I was there. Oh well!

Awareness is a word for Advent. The Gospel begins with 'be on your guard, stay awake'. The word translated as 'be on your guard' is blepó: βλέπω, to look, see, perceive: to see something physical, with spiritual results (perception) in order to take the appropriate action. The word translated as 'be watchful' is agrupneo: ἀγρυπνέω, to be sleepless, wakeful. It also means to wake from the sleep of 'automatic pilot'. How many times have we gone to work, done the shopping or driven somewhere without ever being conscious of doing it? It is as if instinct takes over and we go along with it while thinking about something else or just day dreaming... automatic pilot. Spiritually this is often referred to as sleep or 'sojourning in another country', doing the business of the day without thinking about it. It is this sleep we must wake from in order to see (perceive) the spiritual significance of the world around us, including our thoughts, feelings and actions. As 'Lord of the house' we must come back from our sojourn to our inner being, our house, using our spiritual intelligence, the porter, to make sure the servants, our faculties of will, desire, intent, etc, are 'keeping the house in order'.

During Advent we watch symbolically for the birth of the Lord in history: we also watch for His birth within. For this we need to be aware (awake) of the hypnotising states of consciousness we allow ourselves to get into; states where we are not in control. As we come to know the person we are, by persevering in awareness, we come to recognise the Lord who is part of the very consciousness we are looking at. This recognition is the spiritual birth within. And then we understand with Angelus Silesius, 'Christ could be born a thousand times in Galilee - but all in vain until he is born in me'.


